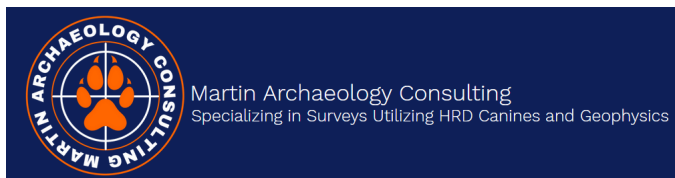

TCAT-Pulaski is one of 27 applied technology colleges across the state serving the citizens of Tennessee. The main campus is located in Pulaski with satellite locations operating in Lawrence County and a current enrollment of 279 students.

MS Williams discussed TCAT's participation in Skills USA which is a nationwide partnership of students, teachers and industry working together to ensure America has a skilled workforce. Skills USA provides educational programs, events and competitions that support career and technical education (CTE) in the nation's classrooms. TCAT-Pulaski is one of only 24 nationwide and the only institution in Tennessee that has received the Skills USA Model of Excellence rating. MS Williams introduced TCAT Students Hayden Feltman and McCauley Kinzer who will be participating in Nashville in an upcoming Electrical Plumbing Construction Technology Program competition. They described the hands on work they performed at the Fair's Riley Green Concert in 2021. This included construction of stage platforms, raising the stage canopy, setting up speakers and sound equipment, plus performing numerous electrical hook ups under the supervision of professional riggers and electricians. Feltman and Kinzer reported that it was very gratifying to be applying the work principles and skills from their TCAT classes in a real world environment.

Arena Events Announced for Middle Tennessee District Fair

The Lawrenceburg Rotary Club has announced the arena event line up for the 2022 Middle Tennessee District Fair. According to Fair Manager Tad Keaton, this year's fair will be a nine day event so we will be bringing back Moto Cross / ATV racing on Friday, September 23 and adding a new event, Midget Wrestling Warriors, on Wednesday. Monday and Tuesday will feature the Junk Car Jump 'n Run, the Tough Truck Challenge is being moved to Saturday, September 24 and the Demolition Derby will be held on Thursday evening. Granger Smith will perform on Friday evening, September 30 and our Truck and Tractor Pull will finish up the fair on Saturday, October 1. The Friday evening concert gets underway at 7:00 PM, the Sunday afternoon give away starts at 6:00 PM, and all other arena events start at 6:30 PM.
