VIRTUAL ROTARY-FEBRUARY 1, 2021: BLACK HISTORY MONTH SERIES, PART 1: THE PAST, PRESENTED BY THE HERMITAGE

Join us for our three part Black History Month series in February.

Erin Adams, Director of Education:

Adams' career has centered on the interpretation and management of historic sites and archives. Adams has served as the Director of Education at Andrew Jackson's Hermitage since 2014. Her career in historic sites began in 2003. She has also served as an educator at several museums in the Washington, D.C. area, including Mount Vernon and the Carlyle House Historic Park. She established the Archives & Special Collections at Freed-Hardeman University in Henderson, Tennessee and most recently filled the post of Executive Director at the Lee-Fendall House Museum in Alexandria, Virginia. Her current side projects include a book on the personal papers of Aloise Taft, whose diaries chronicle women's lives in Middle and East Tennessee during the Great Depression and getting ready to host The Hermitage's first Future Presidents of America Leadership Camp.

Howard Kittell, President and CEO

Kittell is the president and CEO of the Andrew Jackson Foundation, which owns and operates Andrew Jackson's Hermitage. Driven by his passion for American history and the preservation of the sites and landscapes that illustrate those stories, he has held this position since November 2008. Prior to The Hermitage, Kittell was the executive director of the Shenandoah Valley Battlefields Foundation in Virginia, assistant director of the Providence (R.I.) Preservation Society, executive director of the Preservation Coalition of Greater Philadelphia and then executive director of the Chestnut Hill Conservancy, also in Philadelphia. Since graduate school, one of Kittell's career goals had been to work at a presidential museum. Andrew Jackson has proven to be a particularly interesting, consequential and colorful subject. Or, as he often says, "There is never a dull moment with A.J.!"
