Jamestown Rotary Club's annual Chicken Festival is set for Saturday, May 24, 2025. This year's festival will mark the 68 th year! The annual club fundraiser takes place every Memorial Day weekend. The club cooks and sells around 1200 chicken halves each year.

The Chicken Festival kicks off with a 5K Chicken Run & amp; 1 Mile Fun Run at 7:00 AM. Entry fee is \$20 and participants registering early receive a free Chicken Run t-shirt. We do offer a family discount on the entry fee if you register 4 or more race participants. The festival also hosts an annual Classic Car Cruise- In beginning at 10:00 AM. For more information on the 5K Chicken Run or Cruise-In please contact Kara Brannon at 931-704-0475 or email the club at Jamestownrotary@gmail.com.

Race Online registration will begin in April 2025. Signup online for the 5K Chicken Run or 1 Mile Fun Run is at <u>https://runsignup.com/Race/TN/Jamestown/Rotary5KRun</u>. We also welcome local craft vendors to the festival to set up and sell their homemade and local products. Since we sell chicken halves as a fundraiser, we do not allow food vendors except for vendors only selling sweets or sweet treats. Vendor setup fees are only \$35! The Chicken Festival is a major fundraising event for the club. The funds provide four local scholarships to graduating high school students at York Institute and Clarkrange High School, as well as funds for eradicating polio, international projects, local projects, dictionaries for all 3rd graders in the county, local 4-H congress, support of both high school baseball teams. The Jamestown Rotary Club also supports two Interact Clubs, one at York Institute and one at Clarkrange High School.

The Chicken Festival has a history behind it. It was started in the 50's by the Jaycees to promote and recognize the poultry industry in Fentress County. The very first festivals were held at the old Fairgrounds by York Elementary School. Entertainment included Grand Ole Opry stars. The first entertainers included the popular Lester Flatt & amp; Earl Scruggs and the Foggy Mountain Boys, who appeared several times during the early years. Square dancing also took place later that evening on the square downtown.

When the new Fairgrounds opened. the Chicken Festival was moved there and was taken over by the Jamestown Rotary Club. Continuing with tradition after the chicken plant closed in the mid 1980's with help from York and Clarkrange Interact Clubs, the Jamestown Rotary Club annually cooks the best (secret recipe) chicken halves you can find. Join us on Saturday, May 24, 2025 on Memorial Day weekend in Jamestown, TN.
