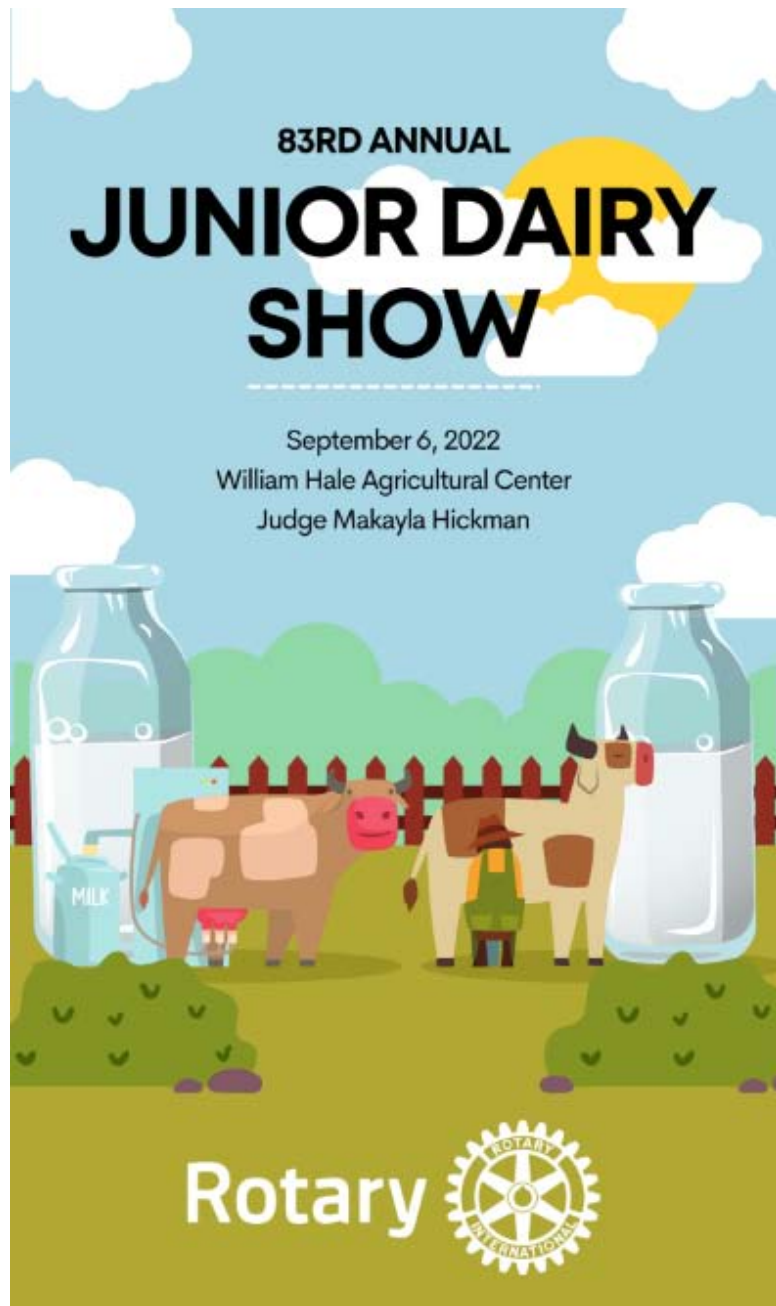
He is the author of several books, including *Practical Faith and Active Love: Meditations on the Epistle of James*, and is the posthumous editor of the works of Michael Mayne.

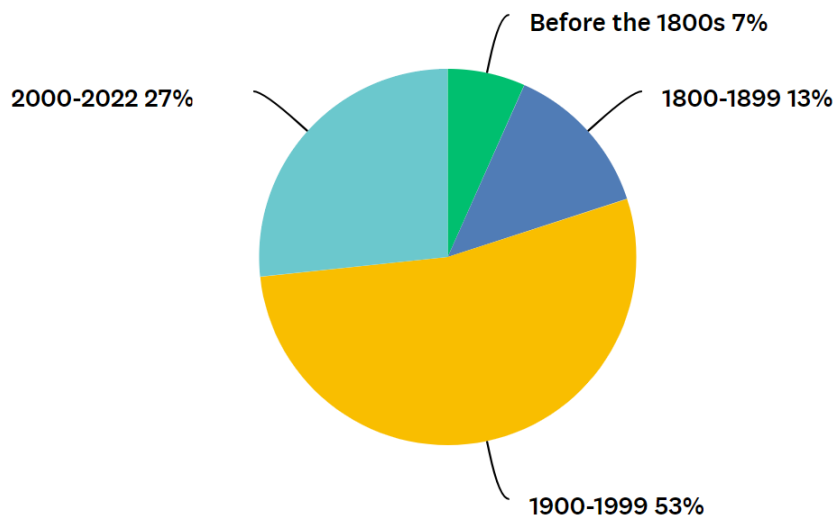
She would like to join Rotary not only for networking but as a way to be involved and have an opportunity to give back to the community.
