The Rotary Club of Cleveland enjoyed an off-site meeting on July 19th at the PIE (Partnerships in Industry and Education) Center. Rotarian Dr. Linda Cash, along with PIE Center Director Brittany Cannon and Kyle Page, PIE Center Property Manager, provided a summary of the project scope and a tour of the three sections of the building.

Utilizing the 1947 original building's slab, roof deck and structure, Bradley County Schools has created a unique asset for our community. With 39 tenant slots, they are at 93% occupancy with only nine slots left. The remaining slots range from 1,200 sf to 11,000 sf. Each of these tenants will engage with students from Bradley, Walker Valley, Polk and Meigs County.

The Conclave portion of the facility received its Temporary Certificate of Occupancy this week, the Center for Sports Medicine will be finishing within a month, and the Smart Factory and Piedmont are still under construction. The Conclave houses assembly spaces, UT Extension, dual enrollment classrooms, and the Event Center.

The Core is home to training spaces for Mechatronics, Machining, and Welding. There is also a space for training for certifications such as OSHA, Quality Control, etc. The concept for the facility is coming from an industry standpoint, not primarily educational, to provide a qualified workforce. The Health Sciences suite is located in the core where CNA and Medtech testing will be provided. A Chemistry program for Chem techs is available through a Cleveland State Community College partnership. In 2023, a Supply Chain Logistics program will be added. A Music Recording Studio is also onsite for mixing and production with the ability to record large groups such as choirs.



Students, faculty, and the public will have access to the JA Coffee and PIE Shop for grab and go lunches. This program will be partnered with the culinary departments at the high schools. Adjacent to this area is the Rymer Conference Room, which can be utilized by the public.

The third portion of the project is Career Residency that houses tenants such as Massey Electric, CSCC HVAC and Plumbing, Boys and Girls Club, Southern Heritage Bank and others. A Medium and Heavy Truck Technology space is provided that can house 4 trucks to pull into the building. Wright Brothers Construction also has a space underway.

Once a thriving industrial facility, a renovated building has been repurposed to provide hands-on training for an array of fields.

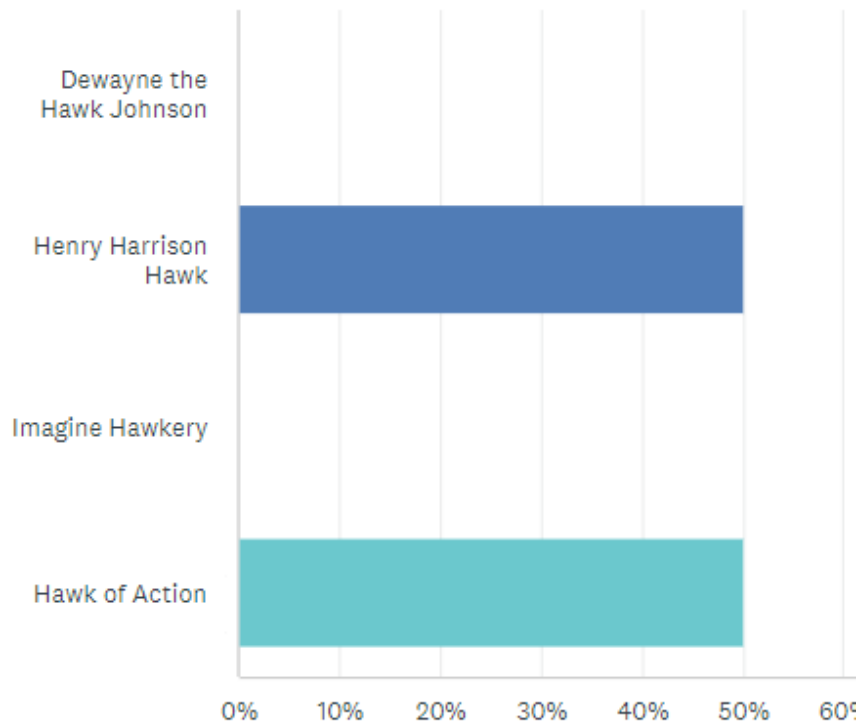
