Club President Bethany McCoy, Dr. Joel Huffstetler, Debbie Huffstetler

This week we had the pleasure of hearing from the Reverend Dr. Joel Huffstetler. He has served as the Rector of St. Luke's since June 2003. He is the author of several books, including Practical Faith and Active Love: Meditations on the Epistle of James. He has spent many years researching the works of Michael Mayne. He said, "In lending Michael's voice, I have found my own."

Michael Mayne was born in 1929 and died in 2006. He held several roles including the head of the religious programs at BBC radio, Rector of the Great Church of Cambridge, and the dean of Westminster Abbey. In 1985 he suffered from chronic fatigue up until he retired in 2005. During this time, he wrote notes which then became his published book, "Year Lost and Found." He published four books in total. Mayne was diagnosed with cancer at the end of his life. He wrote one final memoir about realizing what really matters when you are at the end of your life. The book launch was in September 2006, and he died shortly after in October of the same year.

So how does Mayne's story connect with Cleveland, TN? Fr. Joel was very interested in the works and life of Michael Mayne. Shortly after his passing, Joel reached out to friends and eventually got in contact with Mayne's publisher. Fr. Joel went to England to meet him and retrieved an invaluable gift- every paper, contract, notes, etc. of Mayne's that was at the publishing house. He then met with Mayne's wife, Allison, to talk about his interest in the life of her late husband. Little did he know he would not only gain her trust but would receive boxes of sermons belonging to Mayne.

Fr. Joel went back to England in 2009. He spent a month working on his own collection of books. Three out of five of Joel's books were written on the material he was gifted. He went on to write five books in total; four of which made it to the number one spot in Amazon's Anglican Studies. All proceeds made off these books go to a charity of Allison's choice.

Fr. Joel is so grateful for the opportunities he has been given in his ten years of studying the works of

Sharon Howard, VP Area Manager with Cadence Bank, is proposed for membership by Pam Nelson.

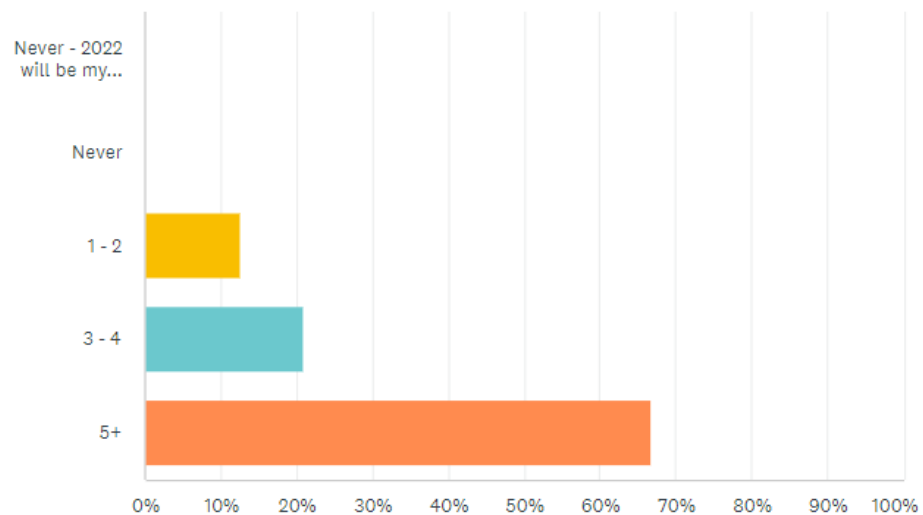

Rotarians who will become Club Presidents on July 1, 2023, should plan to attend the Presidents-Elect Training Seminar - Orientation (PETS-O), where they will begin their journey together for the upcoming 2023-2024 Rotary year.

The awesome responsibility of serving as your Club President requires that we find common ground on what Rotary is and does and how we go about leading our organization.

On Saturday, October 08, 2022, future Presidents will meet together at Stone Memorial High School in Crossville to consider the WHO, WHAT, WHEN, WHERE, WHY, and HOW of the journey to the Club Presidency and prepare for the Mid-South President-Elect Training Seminar (PETS) in March of 2023.

All presidents-elect are required to attend this training. All COVID requirements will be observed.

Note that this in-person training does include the Grants Training this year. Registration begins at 8:00 AM Central time, and the seminar goes from 8:30 AM to 12:30 PM. Grants training will take place in the morning and in the afternoon.
