### DEER RUN RANCH HELPS PEOPLE THROUGH HORSES

Horsers can sense how people are feeling, and how they are breathing.

Horses (and donkeys) can help people facing disabilities, psychological or emotional issues find strength, healing and independence through connection with the animal.

Teri Hamann, CEO of Deer Run Ranch Equine Connection told the club last week that for those who can't ride horses, there is groundwork therapy in which the horse and the person can interact. For those who can ride, Deer Run can offer assistance mounting the horse and take a therapeutic ride around the ranch's new arena, Teri said.

Deer Run has licensed professional therapists, so it can take some health insurance, she said. It also offers special programs for veterans, first responders and children. It partners with the Upper Cumberland Child Advocacy Center, Recovering Crossville, American Legion Post 163 and the Crossville Housing Authority. It opened last September and has five horses and two donkeys on site, she said

Deer Run is located at 431 Old Highway 28, off Route 127 South near the entrance to the Bear Trace golf course.
