
Interactive map of participating Dunkin' locations






TENNESSEE ACHIEVES NOW GIVES STUDENTS OPTION TO PARTICIPATE

This year, students who participate in Tennessee Achieves will do so at their own choosing. Initially, the program, designed to help Tennessee Promise scholarship winners succeed in college or technical school with the help of volunteer mentors, included ALL Promise scholars. That made it more difficult for mentors, who may have had some less enthusiastic students. Tyler Ford, senior director of mentors for Tennessee Achieves, told the club last week of the change to help better match mentors with students who want to be mentored. He pointed out that college, or technical school, can be stressful for students, particularly those who have limited finances. The mentors can help them navigate all they need to navigate in the college processes. He stressed that the program not only helps students succeed, but also helps employers find skilled workers to fill their positions. Also, for students struggling financially, the program offers \$1,000 completion grants to help relieve those pressures, he said.
