FIGHTING OPIOID ADDICTION IS HER MISSION

Providing treatment and recovery from opioid addiction is Heather McLaughlin's mission. Heather, wife of club member Brian McLaughlin, works with Volunteer Behavioral Health and has been helping fight opioid addiction in the area, thanks to a grant derived from a \$7.4 billion settlement nationally from Purdue Pharma of a lawsuit over opioid addiction. Heather, a mental health counselor for 31 years, told the club last week that most families don't see heroin or other illegal drugs in their households. But opioids are common painkillers found and prescribed in many households. She said it's important, if someone is in chronic pain, to have a third party, like a spouse, have control over the drug so it can be administered only as prescribed. She said opioids are still standard medical care in many cases, but the prescribers have put more restrictions on them to prevent addiction. If you are in need of help with substance use, the 24/7 referral line for Volunteer Behavioral Health is 931-266-0646. The Cookeville campus is located at 1200 S. Willow St.
