FOUNDATION ISSUES POLIO UPDATE

Here is a brief polio update that you can share with your clubs to further awareness of Rotary's #1 priority; The Global Eradication of Polio.

- As of November 2nd, there have been 10 confirmed cases of polio worldwide in 2023 (4 in Pakistan; 6 in Afghanistan). At this point in 2022 there were 30 cases, so we are seeing significant year over year improvement.
- By now you are all aware that our 2023 Dunkin' Purple Pinkie Day event was a big success. We raised over \$1.4 Million Dollars this year bringing the total raised since the project to approximately \$6.3 Million.

Our district performed extremely well with 54 Clubs and over 950 Rotarians participating. Donations were up by approximately 15% over last year, bringing the total amount raised (including matches) to \$550,000.

- Several people have asked how the Purple Pinkie matches work, and how a \$25 donation becomes to \$187.50 to PolioPlus. Since November is "Rotary Foundation Month" I think this is the perfect time to explain that, so here's the math:

\$25.00 - Your Purple Pinkie Donation

\$25.00 - District 6780 matches your donation using District Designated Funds (DDF)*

+ \$12.50 - RI Matches the District's DDF contribution to PolioPlus @ 50%

\$62.50 - The total contribution coming from "Rotary"

+\$125.00 - The Gates Foundation matches Rotary's contribution \$2 for \$1

\$187.50 - The total \$\$ to PolioPlus

* What are District Designated Funds (DDF)?

DDF is a portion (50%) of the total contributions made to the Annual Fund by Rotarians and clubs in our district in the Rotary year three years prior to the current year. For Rotary Year 2023-24, these funds were derived from contributions made to the Annual Fund in 2020-21. The Rotary Foundation allows districts to use up to 50% of DDF as grants to clubs for eligible purposes and the remainder to support eligible international projects, including this one...

This is why it's so important to support The Rotary Foundation. Your contributions in 2020-21 are what make this possible. It's a gift that keeps on giving!
