### LARRY TALKS SCHOLARSHIPS

This year, the three Rotary clubs in the county will have \$11,000 to give in scholarships.

Scholarship Chair Larry Doster gave the club a brief overview of the scholarship process, how winners are determined from the applicants etc.

He said he's received several applications so far, but the bulk of them will come in around the first week of April, when he visits the schools to pick up applications.

The three main criteria Larry and his committee use to determine winners are academic progress over the entire scholastic career; participation in extracurricular activities in school and/or community; and need.

Academic progress means that a student has continued to show improvement in scholastic achievement as he or she matures, he said.

Each scholarship check is deposited in a student's account at the school of his or her choice. The checks are marked "Not for Tuition," allowing the student to use the money for other school-related needs such as books, supplies, tools etc., he said.

### STEFANIE PIGEON DISCUSSES ROTARY PROJECTS

Stefanie Pigeon discussed how the club was going to determine what projects it will take on or continue.

Last week's scheduled speaker, Nelson Griswold, was unable to attend the meeting because of illness. He has asked that the club reschedule him.

It was also suggested that we install a clock with a Rotary logo on it on the main Depot sign, to show the day and time of our weekly meetings. Currently, the club only displays a sandwich-board sign outside the Depot on Thursdays during our meeting.

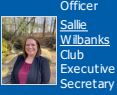
