

3 CLUBS CONDUCT ROTARY FOOD DRIVE

The three Rotary clubs of Cumberland County are conducting a food drive for the school pantries. Members and others can drop off donations at Weichert Realtors-The Webb Agency at 3602 Peavine Road or 874 West Ave.; Cumberland County Playhouse, 221 Tennessee Ave.; First Bank, 139 Elmore Road and Quality Home Health, 131 Webb Ave. #102. The deadline for drop-offs is Aug. 19. The pantries are looking specifically for these items: individual mac and cheese, mashed potatoes, Ramen noodles, Micro Soups, breakfast bars, Pop Tarts, granola bars and juice pouches. Financial donations also accepted.

170 SIGN UP FOR RYLA

So far, 170 students from around the district have signed up for this year's Rotary Youth Leadership Academy day for 2024, according to coordinator Holly Hanson. The event can accommodate up to 180 students, she said. RYLA will be held Sept. 21 at Camp Nakanawa. CHARACTER PROJECT NEEDS LEADERS

The club still has a budget for the character project, but no one has yet stepped up to take the lead on it. Club President Brooke Shaffer last week asked that anyone who wants to chair the character project, or serve on the committee, to notify her within the next week or so. July is the month that the club asks the director of schools for permission to conduct the project. In the past, the project has included distributing coloring books based on Rotary's Four-Way Test to all fourth-graders in the county, and asking each class to have an essay contest in which the students pick a characteristic of the Four-Way Test to write about. Prizes were awarded to the best essays from each class. A new chair may bring a different idea for the project. But, it can't be done without the school director's permission.

NEW OFFICERS FORMALLY ELECTED

Though district officers installed new club officers for the 2024-25 Rotary year June 27, the club, as the bylaws require, voted in the new officers last week. The new officers are: Brooke Shaffer, president; Sarah Hazelton, president-elect. Debbie Albin, vice president; Sallie Wilbanks, secretary; Ginny Dyer, treasurer; Sheryl Webb, immediate past president; Stefanie Pigeon and Ethan Hadley were elected as board members at large. The president, president-elect and vice president will each serve a year. The treasurer and secretary will each serve three years and the at-large directors will serve two-year staggered terms.

TEST YOUR HOME FOR RADON

Radon is a gas formed from uranium that is underground everywhere. It is the leading cause of lung cancer among non-smokers, according to James Alderman of Alderman Home Inspections. James, who spoke to the club last week, is certified to conduct radon tests in homes and other buildings, and urges everyone to have his or her home tested. If radon registers at a certain level — 4 or above, James said — he would recommend mitigation procedures, which he refers to other companies. Fortunately, most of Cumberland County, unlike other nearby counties, has relatively little radon. But he has found some homes that require mitigation. 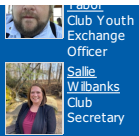

How it works:

1. Please have your members make their checks payable to your club for \$15 per ticket, and then have your club issue a single check (no later than game day) for \$8.50 per ticket sold, made out to the Tennessee Smokies. This check can be turned in at the Polio table near "Will Call" at the stadium on Game Day, August 6th.
2. Ticket vouchers redeemed at the ballpark on August 6th will receive an admission ticket *PLUS* \$6.00 in Stadium Credit that can be used for concessions or at any vendor in the stadium. Vouchers redeemed at the Smokies Ticket Office after August 6th receive an admission ticket but not the Stadium Credit.
3. The \$6.50 donation to "PolioPlus" can be sent to Rotary International by your club at your convenience. (Use Multiple Donor Form 094-EN, if you want individual club members receive donor credit).
