### YMCA TO BE BUILT IN CROSSVILLE

The YMCA is coming to Crossville.

Mandy Perhay, chief executive officer of the Putnam County Family YMCA, will lead both facilities -- at least temporarily.

Mandy told the club last week that the Y will have a learn-to-swim program for second-graders, as it does in Cookeville.

She estimates that it will take 1,000 to 1,100 families to join as members for the Y to break even here.

There are 2,200 member families in Cookeville.

The local Y will be overseen by a Sports Authority, with membership fees, donations etc., covering payment of the bond. No tax revenue is expected to be used to pay back the bond.

Membership fees will be determined, with a sliding scale based on family income. About 25 percent of the Cookeville membership gets some type of reduced rate, according to Mandy.

In addition to the swimming, exercise and other recreational facilities, the Y will have a meeting room for community activities, and the gym can be used for community events.

It will also serve as a community shelter if a natural disaster strikes. The Cookeville Y was a shelter during the recent tornado there, Mandy said.
