KnoxCAM: A Prison Ministry Of Music, Hope & Messages

Dr. Jill Lagerberg's world is music — specifically the musical arts, combining choral presentations augmented by dance, handbells, and orchestra all wrapped around a Christian message communicated from a stage vs. a pulpit. She is the founder and director of **KnoxCAM** (**Knoxville Christian Arts Ministries**) and its primary focus is offering a very effective prison ministry throughout the Volunteer state.

As she says, "KnoxCAM is musical theater that we take to six prisons and present a positive program and for many men and women in prison we're the only people they see other than those at the prisons. This is my ministry in life now."

Jill (pictured here with President Megan) earned her Ph. D in Musical Arts in Voice Performance and Master's of Music from the University of Michigan. She has directed children's choirs for the Knoxville Opera Co. and the Knoxville Children's Choir.



KnoxCAM has approximately 120 members, aged 18 to 90, from 28 different

churches. This ministry's home is Cedar Springs Presbyterian Church. In 2020 KnoxCAM became a 501c3 organization. This will be their 13th season in the prisons. You can get a real feel for Knox CAM at its Friday May 12 concert — "A Requiem for the Living" — at 7 p.m. at Cedar Springs Presbyterian. This will be a performance combining the Cedar Springs and KnoxCAM choirs and full orchestra.

Heart Attacks & Sudden Death: 2 Conditions Best Avoided

Today **Dr. Charlie Barnett's Medical Moment** is about our hearts. It's very interesting and revealing.

A recent study from Denmark looked at nearly 10,000 patients that had no symptoms for ASHD (atherosclerotic heart disease). They then subjected these patients to the imaging procedure CTA, an acronym for a CAT scan of the heart focusing on the coronary arteries. The results were eye-opening.



They found 10% had obstructive lesions to blood flow, 36% had detectable but non-obstructive lesions and 54% with no atherosclerosis. At 3½ years of follow up with those with obstructive ASHD had a

relative risk of heart attack nine times greater than the non-obstructive patients. Knowing the risk focuses treatment guidelines.

Obviously, the unfortunate 10% need intensive therapy for their ASHD, i.e., blood pressure control, cholesterol management, smoking cessation, weight control, exercise, and stress management. The 36% with non-obstructive lesions should be encouraged to follow the same risk reduction program staying ahead of this progressive disease. The good news is that 54% don't have to worry, at least for now. The decision to aggressively treat obstructive disease with stents or surgery is much more complicated. It is best left to the individual patient and their physician.
