Emily Lamon's son celebrated his 8th Birthday on Wednesday, May 15th.

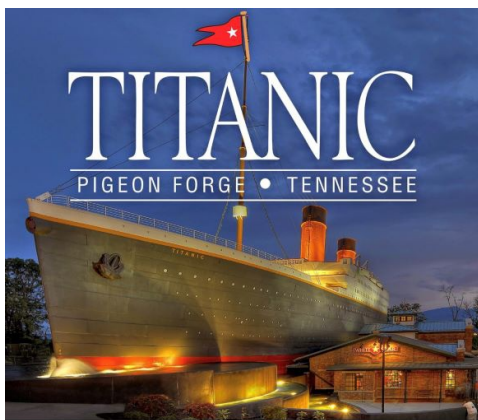
Sara Branson's son will celebrate his 18th Birthday and graduate from High School on Sunday, May 19th.

Honoring the Shoes of 1912

The Titanic Museum located in Pigeon Forge has over 400 artifacts from the Titanic on display, which they also rotate throughout the years. Chris Massie, Executive Vice President of Business Development, excitedly spoke about an addition they are working on at the museum to share and highlight the famous Titanic movie. The Museum recently acquired the panel that was floating in the famous scene where Rose (Kate Winslet) and Jack (Leonardo DiCaprio) were holding on awaiting help after the ship had sunk into the ocean. The panel was purchased for \$718,000.

Each year the museum brings new artifacts for display. This year they are highlighting the children who were aboard the ship. The museum will display the shoes of Alden Gates Caldwell, 10 months old, 2nd Class passenger, and Luise Gretchen Kink, 4 years old, 3rd class passenger. Alden Gates Caldwell was traveling with his parents, who were from Siam. Alden and his parents survived. Luise Gretchen Kink was from Zurich, Switzerland. She was traveling with her parents and her aunt. The Kink family survived the sinking aboard a lifeboat. There were a total of 135 children aboard the Titanic when it sank.

To honor the children of Titanic, the museum has partnered with Samaritan's Feet. Through the partnership, the Titanic Museum works with elementary schools in East Tennessee to bring brand-new shoes and socks for every student attending the school. The volunteers wash the feet of the students, fit them with a brand-new pair of shoes, and give them a pair of brand-new socks. Every child in the school is involved in the day, providing an experience that will bond the children in a special way. For one day at least, everyone has the same type of shoe on, they are all celebrated just for being at school that day, and they all get to feel the joy and hope that comes from the volunteers who give their time to make the event special for each child. The Titanic Museum

and Samaritan's Feet joined together in April 2023 and have already provided over 10,000 pairs of shoes to children in East Tennessee, with plans to reach Blount and Hamblen counties this year. \$25 is the cost for 1 child to receive a new pair of socks and shoes.
