FHS's 865 Academy Coach Dr. Amanda Edsell Speaks Wednesday

Joining us Wednesday will be **Dr. Amanda Edsell,** the coordinator of Farragut High School's (FHS) 865 Academy. FHS is among the first Knoxville County school to participate

in The 865 Academies that began this past fall for incoming 9th graders in the Freshman Academy.

These students are exploring future academy pathways in preparation for choosing an academy prior to their 10th-grade year.



This new program will create career-themed academies at district high schools, which will be known as The 865 Academies. This approach will allow students to participate in authentic, work-based learning opportunities for job shadows and other career exploration activities; work closely with professionals in

their field of interest; and create stronger connections between classroom knowledge and workplace success.

Edsell joined Knox County Schools in 2011 as an English Language Arts teacher and basketball coach at Karns Middle School. She has also worked as a teacher and basketball coach at Bearden High School. She then assumed the instructional coach and Response to Intervention Coordinator role at Bearden High. She worked as an assistant principal at Bearden High School from 2017-2019 and at Bearden Middle School from 2019-2022.

She received a bachelor's degree in English and Youth Ministry from King College, a Master's degree in Secondary Curriculum and Instruction from King College, and a doctorate in Education in Educational Leadership.

Scotland's Gordon McInally Selected To Serve as RI's 2023-24 President

Gordon R. McInally, a member of the Rotary Club of South Queensferry, Lothian, Scotland, is the selection of the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International for 2023-24.

McInally, a graduate of dental surgery at the University of Dundee, owned and operated his own dental practice in Edinburgh. He was the chair of the East of Scotland branch of the British Paedodontic Society and has held various academic positions. He has also served as a Presbytery elder, chair of Queensferry Parish Congregational Board, and commissioner to the church's General Assembly.

A Rotary member since 1984, McInally has been president and vice president of RI in Great Britain and Ireland. He has also served RI as a

director and as member or chair of several committees. McInally and his wife, Heather, are Major Donors and Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation. They are also members of the Bequest Society.

McInally called for members to capture the world's attention and lead the way toward possibilities far beyond our current expectations. In saying that, his theme for our next Rotary year is "Create Hope in the World."

"The goal is to restore hope — to help the world heal from destructive conflicts," McInally said at Rotary's annual training event for incoming district governors.

Mexico Clean Water Grant Complete, 9 Schools Now Have Filtration Systems

There are nine schools in Mexico that now have water filtration systems thanks to a **Rotary District Multi-Club Grant** of \$12,006. Our club is the sponsor club and partnering with us were the other Knoxville clubs — Bearden, Knoxville, Knoxville Breakfast, Knoxville Volunteer, and North Knoxville Rotary.

PP Becky Duncan, our International chair and Grants Coordinator, spent a good amount of time pulling together this grant. The schools are in San Agustin Tlaxiaca near the city of Pachuca, Hidalgo. Many of the people in the communities lag socially and educationally; suffer from lack of economic development, industry and commerce, and migration; and are marginalized due to lack of job opportunities.

The goal of the project was to increase the quality of life and health for the school children in the town of San Agustin who have the services of school cafeterias. Only two of the 11 school cafeterias had water filters to provide clean drinking water for students and school personnel.

The grant is helping approximately 1,408 children and 114 staff members in the nine schools.

Exercise: Even a Little, Counts a Lot

Dr. Charlie Barnett is on an exercise kick today. Give it a read for your health.

Perhaps the discussion of diet and exercise is getting a bit old, but please let me share one more study showing that even brief periods of exercise can make a world of difference.

A recent study from England followed the seven-year mortality of 25,000 people with an average age of 61. Each person wore an exercise monitor watch, such as Fitbit, Apple Watch, etc.



Their results are surprising in that they focused on individuals who had evidence of vigorous intermittent lifestyle physical activity (VILPA) as evidenced by an increased heart rate for periods of 1 to 10 minutes. They found that even 3 bouts per day of 1 to 2 minutes of VILPA, such as climbing steps or a brisk walk, resulted in a 40% decrease in all cause and cancer mortality and a 48% decrease in cardiovascular deaths.
