A Day of Inspiration: Todd Kelly Discusses Living Life Successfully

If **Todd Kelley** did not inspire you it's for sure not his problem. More than a few Farragut Rotarians said it was a perfect day for them to hear and absorb his messages. It's safe to say his program was one of our best of the year.

The former Tennessee football Vol and San Francisco 49ers first-round draft choice stands tall at 6-5, but he's thinned down since his playing weight of 270 to 280.



Kelly was an All-SEC and All-American defensive end and captain of the Vols in 1992 and was a first-round NFL draft choice in 1993 and played four years in the pros, helping San Francisco win Super Bowl XXIX. He's a native of Hampton, VA. His son, Todd Jr., also played for the Vols. He and his family live in Knoxville.

His life today, he says, is built around service, much like Rotary. His wife, he said, is a Rotarian. "I can tell by being here today that this club is getting it done" he said.

Life today revolves around these factors, he offered: People who are solvers, our relationships, our victories, our integrity, our commitment and our execution. "And the things we all need to focus on with energy: health, family, marriage, career and yourself," he said.

He took a moment to say hello to Dr. Joseph Hicks, a longtime friend. "Thanks to Dr. Hicks our children have beautiful teeth," he said.

Kelly is very involved locally with the national organization "100 Black Men" who mentor young black boys with no fathers twice a month and help them prepare for life.

'For My Aging Friends.....That's You!'

The headline is a quote from Dr. Charlie Barnett as he discusses a recent study about our lifestyles and degenerating brain functions in today's Medical Moment.



A remarkable study from the University of Chicago was published this past month in JAMA Neurology, linking a healthy lifestyle to lower dementia despite the physical degeneration of the brain. In this large

study on aging, conducted from 1997 to 2022, there was a subset of individuals who had recorded their lifestyle over the years AND had cognitive testing near the time of their death AND had brain autopsies.

The results are quite interesting in that a healthy lifestyle (see below) is associated with less dementia, independent of the degenerative brain pathology of amyloid plaques and tau tangles which are associated with dementia. In other words, a healthy lifestyle can help protect against dementia despite the progressive degeneration of the brain.

In the study a healthy lifestyle is defined as:

- A Mediterranean diet Rich In plants and fish
- Avoiding or limiting alcohol
- Exercising 150 minutes a week
- Learning new things, playing games, doing puzzles or just conversations with friends
- Not smoking
