

Staying or Leaving? Here's the Update

Are we staying or are we leaving?

That's the question among our members right now after Fox Den hit us with a 54% increase in our per-member meal charge from \$19.50 to \$29 earlier this month. Our three leaders, President Megan Belcher, President Elect Val Privett and Vice President Teri Jo Fox have been working hard to answer this question.

This past week President Megan met with the president of Fox Den's Board of Directors, Mike Charland. "After speaking with Fox Den BOD President Mike Charland last Wednesday, I received a text stating that Fox Den is now willing to meet us in the middle with a lower price. I followed up with Caroline Inman (assistant General Manger) for confirmation and received the following email confirming \$25."

From Caroline Inman: "... It is very important to us to continue partnering and hosting the Farragut Rotary meeting. We will be glad to honor the \$25 (inclusive) price. We hope that this will help encourage your members to vote to stay at The Den!"

Here is the information about three alternatives, and all three have pluses and minuses — Farragut Community Center, Chesapeake's and Top Golf:

- **Top Golf:** Can accommodate 70 people, have agreed to an all-in price of \$20 per member and everyone is encouraged to come see the space on June 6 from 12 noon to 1 p.m.
- Chesapeake's Seafood: Plenty of space, all-in price is approximately \$27.31 per member. Parking could be an issue.
- Farragut Community Center: Great option but consistent availability might not occur until next year. Cost varies by caterer from \$18 to \$24 per member. "The Town of Farragut is moving into the Community

Center this fall while the Town Hall is being renovated. They are still ironing out parking and availability of space," Megan says.

The timeline looks like this — President Megan will present their findings to our Board of Directors on Wednesday, June 7, and our members will vote on the choices on June 14.
