The Goal for Dec. 2 Sock Hop/Cork Pop Wine Tasting Event

Today we begin our venerable Flagship with a first for the Rotary Club of Farragut. The first is "\$50,000!"

The event is another first — our first "50's Era Sock Hop Cork Pop & Wine Tasting Party" at the Farragut Community Center. It is our mega-fundraiser for the year to support the organizations and projects in our community.

Never before have we had a fundraising goal of \$50K in our club's 42-year history. But that's what our Fundraising Committee Co-Chairs Scott Brockamp and Jerry Schwallier have challenged our club to raise from our



Dec. 2 event at the Farragut Community Center and we're really close to being halfway to the goal. As of today we have \$23,500.

Join us for our first fundraiser in three years. Invite your friends, your family, your neighbors — heck, invite the entire neighborhood! Let's make this a remarkable evening of food, dancing, fun, fellowship, and even a "How low can you go?" limbo contest. We'll have a dance contest and maybe a 1950's dress contest.

There will be silent and live auctions for you to bid up your neighbor!

Tickets are \$100 each and the Board of Directors is wanting every member to buy at least two tickets even if they can't attend. \$75 of each ticket is tax deductible. The proceeds will benefit the Rotary Club of Farragut Foundation, a 501(c)(3) non-profit.

"The surgeon removed a small section of the lung and got all of the cancer. The margins are clear. No chemo and no radiation. I have to go back in six months," Nancy said. Bettye Sisco is battling a nasty cold bug right now but feels pretty good, she said. She returns to Duke Medical Center a week from tomorrow to resume her clinical trial for her leukemia.
