## **Larry Hornbaker Passes at 88**



Many of our veteran and long-time members have great memories of **Larry Douglas Hornbaker**, who was a major part of our club after he moved to East Tennessee following an incredible career at Pepperdine University. That said, we pass along the news that Larry, at the age of 88, passed away on Thursday, Jan. 5, 2023 in Arlington, TX. He and wife Carole moved there to be near their children and grandchildren in 2012.

Larry was a Past District Governor twice over for two California districts and is the retired VP at Pepperdine University. While in our club, Larry was our link and Guru about all things related to The Rotary

Foundation, serving as chair and co-chair of our Foundation Committee.

Before he came to us, he was:

- A Zone representative to Rotary International
- Past Dist. Governor in California 1990-91 Dist. 5280
- A delegate to the Council on Legislation
- Permanent Fund Director for the Rotary Foundation
- Past President of the Rotary Club of Malibu

In December 2012 the Board of Directors reluctantly accepted his resignation. Larry has been a distinguished Rotarian for 32 years and joined the Rotary Club of Farragut in 2004. Our club also voted Larry as OUR first-ever Honorary Lifetime Member.

Hornbaker is survived by his wife, Carole; their children, Deborah, Douglas, David, and Darin; six grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren.



and will spend the night under observation, being discharged the following day. In this case, I'll start my proton therapy during the week of September 18." If his cardiologist finds more serious blockages requiring bypass surgery, he'll refer Jim to a cardiac/thoracic surgeon for open heart surgery. That

would obviously delay the proton therapy until after the heart surgery and cardiac rehabilitation. "Needless to say, Diane, Meghan, and I are praying for the former. My thanks to all my Rotarian friends who have sent me cards, e-mails, and online messages of support and encouragement. All of them have said that they're praying for a positive outcome. I definitely thank everyone for their prayers!"

Susan Hoffman, John's better half by far, shows off her new bracelet given to her by the Cancer Team at UT Medical Center to celebrate five years of being cancer free. Five years ago she was diagnosed with a relatively small Estrogen Receptor positive breast tumor. This was completely unrelated to her 2010 bout with breast cancer. After a mastectomy, she spent the last five years on either Tamoxifen or Arimidex to increase her odds of successfully overcoming the danger of recurrence. "On August 30 Dr. Panella released her from further treatment with no evidence of cancer to be found. It has been a long hard fight, and we are grateful for this good news. Dr. Panella gave her a survivor's bracelet with the number 5 on it," John says. Great news for Susan and John!!!!
