PRESIDENT'S CORNER

As another month zooms by, I want to share some survey results from the **Rotary Action Group on Mental Health Initiatives from Rotary International President Gordon McInally**. It is encouraging to see the embrace of mental health initiatives throughout the Rotary world, as well as learn about real life practical ways that our Rotary club can use to improve the personal well-being of members.

The top suggestions that Rotary members are asking for are: more fellowship, camaraderie, conversation, cohesiveness, and connection. I believe that this is a strength of our club as many times after I ring the bell to start the meeting, I must wait for the fellowship to cease before I begin with my remarks, I love that! Other survey responses noted that Rotarians want more recognition, validation, and integration. I believe that one way that we are addressing this is through the good news segment that begins each meeting, giving our members an opportunity to share something good that has happened in their lives over the last week.

Responses also showed that Rotarians are seeking more service opportunities, and they want more wellness activities, including mental health speakers, awareness efforts, and education. We continue to focus on this as one of the themes of our program speakers throughout the year. Rotarians recently exhibited hope and love to our community by serving at Compassionate Hands. The Service Project committee will also be hosting for a meeting in March a service project during our regular meeting time, thus giving even more Rotarians the opportunity to serve.

Another great way that we can help achieve these results and make Rotary more appealing to those considering membership is to acknowledge the importance of increasing belonging in our clubs and to encourage Rotary members to make the most of every opportunity for new and stronger connections. Public health experts worldwide are concerned about increasing levels of loneliness — the U.S. surgeon general has even declared it an epidemic. Mental health experts agree that finding groups and clubs around common hobbies and interests is a strong way to create greater connectedness. This is what Rotary is all about. We need to make sure all our members are fully engaged and that our communities are better aware of this inherent strength.
