April was another busy month. Iris hiked a lot with her host sister and other family/friends, experiencing much of the Polish countryside. One hike ventured into the Czech countryside, ending at an 18th century church tower. Iris referred to this one as the enforced march – her sister neglected to mention it was a very hilly 4+ mile hike!

Rotary organized a trip to Krakow for all the inbound students where they toured the famous Krakow salt mines and visited Auschwitz-Birkenau, the former Nazi concentration camp.



Back in Wroclaw, Iris attended the very formal Easter dinner with her Rotary club and celebrated the holiday with her extended host family. She and another Wroclaw inbound student made a presentation to a large Rotaract club in the city. (Rotaract interests her and played a role in her decision to attend Virginia Tech next year since there is a large, active Rotaract club at the university.)


