### "THE BEST 10 DAYS OF THE YEAR!"



### GRANTS FROM ROTARY FOUNDATION MAKING A DIFFERENCE!

Andy announced last week that the Board had approved grants from our Rotary Foundation to support two important causes - Read to Succeed and A Secret Safe Place for Newborns of Tennessee.

### **Read to Succeed**

Now beginning its fourth year, Read to Succeed is a local initiative supported by the four Rotary Clubs in Wilson County. The program provides books to first graders each month during the school year. Cris Teal has served as our lead volunteer since the program began, but she is now handing the baton to Elaine Nawiesniak.



As we start a new school year, Elaine is asking for more volunteers to participate. Each month, volunteers pick up books and place the Rotary label in each one. They then take the books to Jones Brummett Elementary, Castle Heights Elementary, and Coles Ferry Elementary. Last school year, about 4000 books were delivered to the three schools!
