READ TO SUCCEED ROTARY BOOK PROGRAM

For the 4th year, Wilson County Rotary Clubs helped to donate a book a month to every 1st grader in the County. The goal is to foster a love of reading at a young age, laying a strong foundation for learning. Rotarians fix a Rotary Club label for the child to write their name inside the cover, and then they deliver books to the schools from September through May. Each child receives their brand-new book every month, and it is theirs to keep!

By the end of this school year, over 100,000 books will have been distributed since the program's inception. Read to Succeed started years ago when members of the Mt. Juliet Breakfast Rotary Club were approached by teacher Aubrey Hamblen. She realized that reading proficiency was low and many students at her school didn't have books of their own to read at home. The program has expanded to all 18 elementary schools in Wilson County, Tennessee supported by three Rotary Clubs in 2024.

"It has been an absolute gift to be able to provide students with a new age-appropriate, self-chosen book every month of the school year! The students greatly enjoy receiving their books...they get SO excited", says Aubrey Hamblen.


