Dear Fellow Rotarians,

Earlier this week you were emailed an application form for the William T. Sergeant Vocational Services Award as well as the list of prior recipients. This is the most prestigious award this club presents each year. The purpose of the award is to recognize a person who has enriched our community through exemplary service within and/or through that personâ€<sup>™</sup>s vocation.

Below are the suggested requirements:

- The recipient must be a person whose vocational service has been exemplary; whose talents have been used for the good of the community, the region or society, beyond normal expectations; and whose work has been recognized as substantial.
- The recipient must be highly respected and must have been so recognized by vocational peers.
- The recipientâ€<sup>™</sup>s vocational service must have enhanced the Oak Ridge community. Although the
  recipient is normally of the Oak Ridge professional community, this criterion does not preclude making
  this award to a person whose professional activities have been elsewhere as well as in Oak Ridge.
- The recipient may be a Rotarian or a non-Rotarian, and the award can be presented posthumously.

It's almost time. Flatwater Tales Storytelling Festival kicks off June 8 at 7:00 at the Historic Grove Theater.
