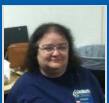

**PROGRAM**

Phil Voegtli, his wife, and three cats come to us from Colorado and he is delighted to be here where there is also a lot of hiking and other outdoor activities. His favorite outdoor pastime though, is fishing.

He comes to Oak Ridge because Burns & McDonnell, one of the top 10 engineering and design firms in the US, has established a permanent office here in Commerce Park. Phil, a civil engineer will be the head of this office which will be focused on federal projects where ever they occur, including a variety of energy projects. Over time they will grow their local staff and are already looking to recruit graduates from UT.

Their immediate work is to design and oversee construction of a \$2 Billion project that will provide a second to ORNL SNS. The design process should be completed by 2026, while construction will not be finished until 2026. It will be a factor of 10 brighter than the first target and add 22 new beam lines.

Burns & McDonnell wants to be involved in the community and they have already begun working on the design of a green space and science park for the first phase of development along Wilson Street!
