Announcements:

Jim Michel pointed out that November is Rotary Foundation month and this past year we helped 22 local organizations. Jim encourages us to consider an end-of-year contribution to our Foundation. Jim Palmer followed that up with a specific suggestion: Our Peace Builder group is planning a four-part program next Spring titled, "Roots of America", looking at diversity in our roots. We will need support to pay expenses of visiting and perhaps refreshments for listeners. One program will include Native American speakers talking about returning Clingman's Dome to its original Cherokee name. Program:

Our speaker planned for today had literally disappeared when Tony tried to reach him, so **President Lydia** stepped up to talk about her post-retirement work managing Brownfield amelioration. Brownfields are deteriorating, previously used sites where hazardous substances make reuse dangerous or risky. EPA grants are available to identify the types of waste, what measures can be taken to clean them up and then to manage the actual cleanup. The object is to restore these sites to pleasant green spaces or productive, tax-paying use. She has been involved in a number of sites in East Tennessee.
