



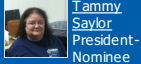

Announcement for Annual Club Awards Linda Brown Rotarian of the Year and Service Above Self

Nomination Period opens March 6, 2024, and closes April 3, 2024.

It is the time of year to select and recognize a few individuals that have worked hard for the betterment of our community. Your help is needed to nominate individuals that meet the criteria for:

The "**Linda Brown Rotarian of the Year**" Award is an honor given by the Oak Ridge Breakfast Rotary Club to one or more members who have served the club with distinction during the Rotary Year. It is given annually and carries a donation to the Rotary Foundation or ORBRC Foundation on behalf of the honoree or his/her designee. Active and Honorary Members of ORBRC are eligible.

"The Board of Directors has voted unanimously to combine the Linda Brown Angel Award with the Rotarian of the Year Award. We are seeking nominees for the Linda Brown Rotarian of the Year Award."

The "**Service Above Self**" award is an honor given by Oak Ridge Breakfast Rotary Club to recognize individuals or groups that have performed exceptional and sacrificial service of a volunteer nature over a significant period of time. This award may be given as often as once per year, but only when deserving recipients are identified. The award carries a monetary grant to further the work of the recipient. Active Rotarians are not eligible.

Arlene Amarante is an Assistant Professor of Law at Lincoln Memorial University, where she teaches Legal Writing, Immigration Law, Asylum Law, and Critical Race Theory. She practices immigration law. Prior to joining the LMU faculty in the fall of 2019, she served as an instructor, a clinical supervisor, the executive director of a nonprofit law firm, and a legal aid attorney. Amarante's degrees include a B.A. from the University of Nevada, Las Vegas; an M.S. from the University of Edinburgh; and a J.D. from Nova Southeastern University. A first-generation American whose parents immigrated from Mexico, she grew up between the United States and Mexico.

Summary of Presentation

Questions of identity and belonging have (re)emerged in the United States ever since our founders established a hierarchy of membership through the notion of citizenship. This talk traces a series of immigration laws over a period of more than two hundred years to the present to illustrate how Latinos are presumptively excluded from entering the United States. Amarante incorporates her family history and draws parallels with other insider-outsider populations, including Palestine, to illustrate the sometimes-harrowing consequences of inclusion by exclusion.
