## MESSAGE FROM OUR DISTRICT GOVERNOR

I want to congratulate each of you for an amazing year. Yes, we have had to deal with a pandemic and the difficulties of change but, that change has opened opportunities. When I attended District Governor training January a year ago and the theme for this year was announced, I had no idea it was prophetic and not just inspirational.

Many of you have implemented a virtual option to your meetings and intend to continue because of the convenience it offers members and the opportunities that presents for programs originating anywhere in the world. Some of you have become extremely focused on the needs of your communities. Some of you have responded to natural disasters through the support of clubs in this district. We have met every challenge this year, except one.

Next year many clubs will find it difficult to find the projects they want through district grants. This is because two years ago, Rotarians of this district failed to contribute as much to the annual fund as we had in the past. This year we all enjoyed maximum district grant funding of \$4,395 per club. Next year it will be \$2,840. We cannot do anything about that now or what funding is available in 2022-23. But we can ensure adequate funding for DGND Mary Grace and her team to distribute. That choice is yours.

I have sent personal letters to each of our Paul Harris Society members thanking them for their faithful giving. The commitment of these 114 Rotarians contributing \$1,000 a year to The Rotary Foundation gives this district a solid basis for contributing to our communities and having an impact on the world. I also want to thank all of you who are sustaining members and contribute \$100 a year and meet Rotary International's challenge of Every Rotarian Every Year.

Let this next year's district grant maximum be a reminder of just how important our contributions are and be our inspiration. We have until June 30<sup>th</sup> to give Mary Grace the opportunity to distribute more District grant funds than any other District Governor in our history. If you have not contributed to The Rotary Foundation this year, please do so. If you have not committed to yourself to contribute \$100 a year, please consider. And finally, if you see the enormous value of our organization and have the financial ability, please consider joining the Paul Harris Society.
