## Recognize members for their efforts with the Avenues of Service award

When members take the time and make the effort to engage with their club, community, or others, they are volunteering their energy and other resources without an expectation of anything in return. Recognizing them for their efforts lets them know that they are valued and appreciated. Club presidents can honor their members for efforts such as serving on a committee, leading activities, helping other members, and growing the club by <u>submitting a nomination for one or more of the Avenues of Service awards</u> at any time. Nominations are forwarded to district governors who review them and determine eligibility. After members have received district recognition in all Avenues of Service, governors can <u>submit a nomination for the RI Avenues of Service Award</u>.
