

#### STATUS

The Governor is an officer of RI nominated by the clubs of a district and elected by the convention of RI. The governor's term of office begins on 1 July and continues for one year or until a successor is elected and qualified.

#### **CUALIFICATIONS**

In addition to the qualifications of governor nominee (below), a governor, at the time of taking office, must have completed seven years of membership in one or more clubs and have attended the governors-elect training seminar and International Assembly.

#### DUTIES

The district governor's responsibilities can be found in Lead Your District: Governor (233). This manual is updated annually. ( <a href="CLICK HERE FOR CURRENT MANUAL">CLICK HERE FOR CURRENT MANUAL</a>) In addition to fulfilling their responsibilities, district governors are expected to adhere to the Rotary Code of Ethics.

### GOVERNOR NOMINEE MUST;

- 1. At the time of taking office must have been a member of one or more Rotary Clubs for at least seven years.
- Have full qualifications for membership in the strict application of the club membership provisions, and have a classification whose integrity is without question.
- 3. Have served as president of a club for a full term or be a charter president of a club, having the full term from the date of the charter to June 30, provided that this period is for at least six months.
- 4. Demonstrate willingness, commitment, and ability, physically and otherwise, to fulfill the duties and responsibilities of the office of governor as provided in RI Bylaws section 15.090.
- 5. Demonstrate knowledge of the qualifications, duties and responsibilities of governor as prescribed in the RI Bylaws, and submit to RI, through its general Secretary, a signed statement acknowledging a clear understanding of them. This statement shall also confirm that the Rotarian is qualified for the office of governor and willing and able to assume the duties and responsibilities of the office and to perform them faithfully.

### District News: Membership Growth Through Public Image

In recent newsletters we have outlined elements of a Membership Campaign to grow our numbers within District 6890. If you were following the March 2022 membership newsletter article, we were outlining a campaign to increase our members district-wide. The topic was the "target rich environment" in Florida, as the State is number #3 in the Nation with mobile residents residing in this area. We introduced three membership **Areas of Focus** (AOF). In May, we discussed programs relating to the attraction and recruitment of new members, as well as retaining our current members. Now let's talk about AOF #3, or Public Image activities to publicize your club's good work and support recruiting and retention.

AOF #3 supports your club by letting potential club members and Rotarians know what your club is about and what they can do in their communities-at-large. To reach both groups, your club needs Internal Communications directed at your members, and External Communications or Public Image & Marketing efforts to reach potential members and into your surrounding communities within your focused areas.

Internal Communications are your newsletters, websites, Facebook Pages, your meetings, and don't forget emails and phone calls that serve to keep your Rotarians informed and aware of what your club is doing. Informed club members are inspired and will stay attracted and engaged. As a result, it will make your Rotarians better recruiters. Your club also needs to reach prospective members within your local communities through External Communications, to include Public Image & Marketing efforts. There are two types of external communications, Earned Media, and Paid Media:

- Earned Media are stories and articles about your club that are carried and published by news outlets. Local and regional news outlets are looking for stories about community service and charitable giving. Many times, they don't have a dedicated reporter to cover an event or to write a story. Your club can get various stories into the news by having someone in the club to write a story or press release about what your club is currently doing. Ensure that you give the "who-what-when-where" of the activity in the story to news outlets covering all Rotary club activities. Not only will your club receive publicity for your good works, but it's free, and has the added benefit of letting your current Rotarians know they are being recognized in the community for their superior efforts.
- · Paid media is advertising to reach potential new members. There are many local and regional news outlets that will run

advertisements at a reasonable price but, the drawback is there is a cost or fee to run any such ad.

Internal and External Communications and Public Image are essential elements to support any membership campaign and your club's recruiting and retention efforts. Remember, do not delay - get the word out ...... NOW!
