



## **District 6890 Foundation Disaster Relief Update**

Puerto Rico following Hurricane Fiona

This year, although we have had very few storms that effected our Rotary Zone 34, they have been mighty.

The impact of both Hurricane Fiona in Puerto Rico on September 18<sup>th</sup> and Hurricane Ian in Florida on September 28<sup>th</sup> will be very memorable for all the wrong reasons.

Although the storm was only a category 1, Hurricane Fiona produced up to 30" of rain in some parts of Puerto Rico. All the islands 1.5 million people were without power, hundreds of thousands were without water and 13 people lost their lives. The economic hit will be in the billions. In an area that never fully recovered from Hurricanes Maria and Irma in 2017, the weakened infrastructure could not withstand the force.

When District 6890 made the ask, our members answered. Since that time, we have received \$16,100. The District Foundation matched the first \$5,000, which allows for a total of \$21,100 for distribution to our neighbor island. We are currently in discussion with their District Governor to determine the best way to help. Only ten days after Fiona, Ian came roaring across Florida and left almost complete destruction in many parts of the state, including our own District. The destruction of the coastline has been well documented and is utterly unimaginable. What we haven't seen so much of is the destruction caused in our own District to our friends and fellow Rotary members. The entire city of Wauchula was without power and underwater in the wake of the storm. Also impacted were many parts of Polk and Highlands counties. To date, the state of Florida has suffered 97 deaths as a result.

I think it is important to mention our District 6890 Diaster relief chair, Kevin Kitto who responded quickly to people in need. He made lists of items that were required, collected those items and was on the scene with other Rotarians and volunteers to assist in clean up and support efforts.

Our generous members were still giving donations for Puerto Rico, when we asked for donations for Florida and District 6890. I am pleased to let you know that we have collected \$21,105 to date and with the District 6890 Foundation match, we have \$26,105 in funds to distribute to causes here in Florida.

Thank you to all our members who had it in their heart to give. An update on projects or funds that we were able to support will be coming soon.
