

4. Choose Annual Fund - This gives your club DDF, District Designated Funds, which means that half your donation will come back to your club after 3 years.

- 5. Choose Recurring Donation
- 6.Select Frequency- choose from Monthly, Quarterly, or Annually 7.Choose Amount- \$10, \$50, \$100, \$200, or Other
- 8. Personal Information, Payment Details, and Billing Address
- 9.Click on Submit
- 10.Print your Confirmation
