

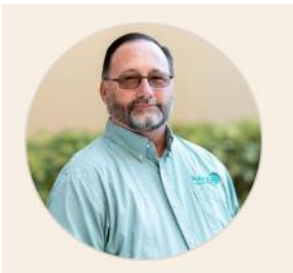

Hi. There are some folks who think business exposure does not belong in Rotary, or at least it needs to be toned down. I couldn't disagree more.

Younger, prospective Rotarians trying to get established in business may very well be attracted to Rotary because of that opportunity: folks finding out what they do, in case they're ever needed. Hey, for one happy dollar, you can share with the club how your business is doing. That plus dues is still a lot cheaper than joining a networking organization. That's an advantage for Rotary.

After all, our vocation or career titles often appear on our name badges. Paul Harris and the other few men in his original club most definitely did business with each other. And doing business with a fellow Rotarian is a powerful expression of trust and confidence.

Don't be shy about it. Let Rotarians visit the podium and share what they do.

It's perfectly fine and appropriate.

District Governor Steve Overton Message

A new fiscal year. New beginning, new opportunity to grow your club, to add or expand projects. Rotary leaders with impressive titles like president or governor or chair, care only about one thing: Success. And how do we define that? Same way you do! Healthy, effective clubs, meaningful projects that change lives, & support for RI.

RI President Gordon McInally coined the phrase "Create Hope in the World" as his theme for the year, and what a great choice. Every time RI issues a grant, it creates hope. But, so do you when you give to RI or help with a local project. Or when you simply take a moment to ask someone, "So how have you been?"

In fact, there's not another question I can think of that creates such a fast, open, honest answer as "So, how have you been?" Almost without exception, the person hearing that question will tell you exactly what is on the top of her or his mind. A new baby. A wedding, a financial setback. A health issue. If you sincerely ask the question, you'll likely get a sincere answer. So listen, therefore, and respond with love. Any relationship depends on that exchange in one form or another, and so does Rotary, after all, a family. We are a family at the International Convention, a family at Zone Leadership Summit, a family at all three PETS, a family at RLI, and a family in our own clubs, at our projects and socials, in our own communities.

Rotary is committed to its seven areas of focus, and it's up to all of us to support that. But we also support each other. A club is an organism, each member with a job, all working together toward a common goal. There is strength in that unity. And that power transforms our local communities, our country, the world. One grant at a time, one project at a time. I remember I was starting a new career back in 2000 and felt overwhelmed by all the tasks in front of me. My trainer said, "When you have so much to do you don't know where to start....begin."
