Rotary Program 02-28-2023 - Dr. Cynitha Lester - GA State University

Dr. Cynthia Lester is interim dean of Georgia State University's Perimeter College, one of the largest associatedegree-granting colleges in the nation.

As interim dean, Lester is the executive officer for the college and is responsible for academic, administrative, research and service functions. The interim dean reports to the senior vice president for academic affairs and provost of Georgia State University and is responsible for visionary, innovative leadership and effective administration of the college. Perimeter College offers five campuses servicing metropolitan Atlanta—Alpharetta, Clarkston, Decatur, Dunwoody and Newton County. It also offers an extensive online program that is one of the largest of any college in the University System of Georgia.

Before assuming the role as interim dean in February 2022, Lester was senior associate dean for academic affairs. She was responsible for leading all college academic initiatives, including academic proposal review, assessment

and accreditation; new pathway development; and curriculum development, review, revision, and implementation. Lester also led faculty and administrative searches, supervised and evaluated department chairs, chaired the department chairs council, and served as the academic initiative's team facilitator.
