

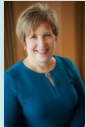

## Rotary Fellowship Fund

Sunday, July 14, 2024

Marilyn Margolis recently announced the newly formed Rotary Fellowship Fund as follows:

### Fellowship Fund Membership

- **Goal-** Grow the number of members that will generate innovative ideas, more donors to events, young members participation and secure the future of Rotary.
- Offer a Fellowship fund rate for members who don't have corporate sponsorship and cannot manage the Rotary membership
- Create a Fellowship Fund as a line item in the Operational Budget of the club to assist in covering members who need assistance. Established Rotarians can contribute to this to assist new members. Annually the unused balance will go directly to the operational budget.
- Board approval is unchanged for all new members as well as the sponsorship award based on need.
- There will be a request of consideration for all established Rotary members to donate to the Young Professionals fund, which is totally voluntary.
- The fellowship fund approval will be reviewed twice a year.

### Fellowship Fund Fee Structure:

- The Fellowship Fund is available for two years at the \$1200.00/ year fee structure.
- All applicants must complete a form for approval by the board. This is completely confidential and available to current members and new members based on the ability to pay for a two year period.
- If a change in the ability to pay or If reimbursed by their organization, the fellowship fund recipient has a responsibility to notify the board president.
- All would be subject to board approval based on need.
- All fellowship members are required to pay \$150.00 per year to cover application fees. Also must follow all Rotary guidelines and participate in service projects.

If you find yourself in a situation where the Rotary Fellowship Fund may apply, please see Marilyn Margolis or Arthur Holst for an application.

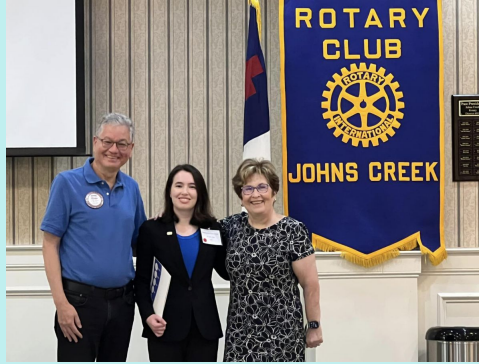
