### Did you know that Rotary District 6910 is a Peace District?

We commit \$25,000 per year to support Rotary Peace Centers around the world. Rotary Peace Centers provide training, advance educational opportunities, support academic interactions and promote greater tolerance and cooperation. Currently there are six centers located in Japan, England, Australia, Sweden, Thailand, and in North Carolina (Duke/UNC Chapel Hill) here in the United States. Peace Centers offer master s degrees and professional development certificates in fields related to peace studies and conflict resolution. Selection criteria to be accepted into

one of these programs includes demonstrated leadership skills, commitment to peach and international understanding and related career goals. Those pursuing the master s degree must have an undergraduate degree and at least 3 years of relevant work experience. Those seeking a certificate must have at least 5 years of relevant work experience. In January each year Clubs and Districts work to recruit applicants. By June interviews and selections are complete. The Rotary Foundation processes applications June-September and in October final Peace Fellows are chosen by a selection committee

Remember you can still report your Club \( \Phi \) s food projects in the Feed10Millin database by clicking on this \( \frac{\link}{\link} \).

- As of this morning District 6910 has provided 1,041,442 meals
- That equals 625 tons of food
- We have done 149 food projects so far average of 5 projects every week
- 32 of our 73 Clubs have reported a food project in the Feed10Million database

Most important of all we have helped thousands of families in our communities. According to the Georgia Food Bank Association the number of food insecure people in the counties served by District 6910 Rotary Clubs has increased by 67% from 362,230 to 540,720 people.




