Gus Allbritton
Volunteer Extraordinaire

Originally from Dade City, Florida, Mr. Gus Allbritton is a decorated U.S. Army veteran who served in Vietnam immediately after high school graduation with the 173rd Infantry Regiment in 1969 to 1970 after receiving his basic training at Ft. Benning, Georgia. At 20-years-old, he was awarded his third Purple Heart at Ft. Hood, Texas. After honorable discharge in 1971, Allbritton moved back to Florida where he earned a Bachelor of Business Administration degree from the University of Florida. He served as a sheriff's deputy and bailiff as well as doing a stint as a bail bondsman. Not quite the career it is currently romanticized to be, Mr. Allbritton notes.

He began receiving VA services in January 1985 in Tampa after realizing that his adjustment to civilian life had not gone as well as he had thought—or hoped.



In 1991, Allbritton began what would be a nearly 32-year career volunteering at the Carl Vinson VA Medical Center in Dublin, Georgia. Becoming a virtual fixture at the medical center—and often the first person that staff and visitors met on entering the medical center's administration building—he accumulated more than 37,000 hours of service. Rarely missing a day and often working after hours, weekends, and holidays to help the VA and its veterans, Allbritton is a repeat VA Volunteer of the Year recipient. Ultimately, he would acquire the moniker “volunteer extraordinaire” to describe his dependability and devotion to veteran healthcare.

In 1994, Allbritton worked closely with VA Sec Jesse Brown, John McCain, Bob Dole, and Dr. Bolivar Martineau to bring PTSD services to Dublin VA, inaugurating a comprehensive program of care that has aided thousands of veterans and continues to expand.

Renowned at the VA for using his guitar picking skills to entertain staff and guests alike, Allbritton worked closely with facility communications and was often called on to represent the VA to local and national media, discussing services and programs in the hope of encouraging other veterans to take advantage of the VA benefits that they have earned. He was especially passionate about promoting treatment for PTSD and in VA's suicide prevention efforts.



After an exceptionally educational divorce in 2006, Allbritton started to go back to home of Tampa, but decided to stay because Dublin VAMC felt like home.



He is a member or former member of multiple Veteran Service Organizations (VSOs) including the America Legion, Disabled American Veterans, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 6605, the Military Order of The Purple Heart, and was co-founder of the Combat Veterans Group. He is a member in devout and good-standing at Bethsaida Baptist Church in Dublin.

In 2023, Allbritton officially “retired” from his volunteering career at the Carl Vinson VA Medical Center but remains involved with the medical center's efforts to provide high quality healthcare to America's heroes, making speaking appearances, and still promoting VA programs and services to his fellow veterans. A regular at Memorial Day, Veterans Day, Flag Day, and other national observances, as a sterling example of service and patriotism, Allbritton is often called upon to render the Pledge of Allegiance and does so with the same pride and integrity with which he has lived.

He is a member of the America Legion, Disabled American Veterans, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 6605, the Military Order of The Purple Heart, and Co-Founder of The Combat Veterans Group as well as the Bethsaida Baptist Church.
