Next, Gary Wheat came to the podium to resume what used to be a regular feature of our meetings, "Rotarians in the News." Today's highlights were:

- **Dr. Keisha Callins** received the inaugural Sandra Dunagan Deal Rural Service Fellow award, established in September 2022 by Mercer University School of Medicine (MUSM) to honor former first lady of Georgia Sandra Deal and her commitment to education, volunteerism and community involvement. This award recognizes a faculty member, community partner or volunteer who has made significant contributions to mentoring, inspiring and encouraging Mercer medical students to care for Georgians in rural, underserved areas.
- NewTown Macon Josh Rogers: Exciting News! Last week, Cadence Bank committed a game-changing \$9 million contribution to NewTown Macon's loan program, bolstering their mission to revitalize the local community. As Central Georgia's first Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI), New Town Macon is dedicated to empowering local businesses and people.
- **Gene Dunwoody** was one of the speakers last week giving tribute to the former Greater Macon Chamber of Commerce Building as it was demolished following its service since 1974. Gene's speech was featured online as well as reference during news coverage from the local affiliates.


David Aiello then came up to introduce speaker, Alex Morrison. As a member of our club, Alex is well-known to most. David says Alex possesses a combination of knowledge, expertise, and passion for our community and its development. He has served as Executive Director at the Macon-Bibb County Urban Development Authority since 2011. He graduated from Mercer University and received a Master of Public Administration from the University of Georgia.

Alex said when he was an undergrad, there wasn't a program to bring Macon-area projects together but we now have the Macon Action Plan and other paths to revitalize the area.

Back when it was first built, the Macon Mall was a vital regional retail center, situated in the center of both the

Macon area and the state of Georgia. Like many other malls across the country, Macon Mall entered a period of decline. The plan in place now can change all that. The centerpiece is the amphitheater, which will be the second largest in Georgia and uses a state-of-the-art design. Other amenities include a library and what could be the nation's largest pickleball court. The location is still good, with easy access to two interstate highways, and the amphitheater project will transform the area for years to come.

HOW TO MAKE UP MISSED MEETINGS

Please make up missed meetings to help our club's attendance percentage rank with District 6920 and Rotary International. Our attendance is reported each month to the district and is required to be reported before the 15th of the following month. **Members are required to maintain an attendance average of 60%.** Missed meetings must be made up **14 days before or after the meeting you miss**.

See list above of approved makeups. You can make up from the comfort of your home or office online at http://rotaryeclubone.org/ They will email a notice of the makeup to the Club Administrator and you will be credited. Also, attendance at another Rotary Club is a good option when you are traveling!

When you make up using the **Zoom link** of our meetings listed in meeting summary above or makeup in person at another club please send an email immediately afterwards to the Club Administrator, steve@eggmedia.com so your makeup can be recorded. Do not expect the club you visit to report to our club.

Excused Absences

Members have the opportunity to receive a board approved Excused Absence during a long-term family, health, or business crisis. When a member realizes they have a situation that will keep them from attending Monday meetings for an extended period they can contact the Club Administrator or President with the reason. This contact needs to be immediate and not after the crisis. The board can approve a beginning and ending date and attendance is excused on club and district level. Short term absences are best made up online.

Club Membership Applications

We are purpose-driven leaders of influence and action. To sponsor a prospective candidate to join our membership, contact Membership Chair Charles Olson EOlson200@msn.com or any member of the Board of Directors to ensure a vocational classification is available for your candidate.

Once the Classification Committee approves the classification, invite your new member candidate to a weekly meeting. If the candidate expresses interest in joining our club, then ask Membership Chair Charles to send the candidate an invitation to apply online. Once the new member candidate completes the application, Board members review the application. Then, new member candidates are presented for formal approval at the monthly Board meeting. Once approved by the Board, new member candidates are announced in Throbs. Unless there is objection by any existing member, the new member is scheduled for orientation and formal induction. All members of our club need to think about who would make good Rotarians!
