MEETING November 13, 2023

President Stephanie rang the bell to start the meeting. After thanking Jackie she welcomed District Governor Felix Smith. Jeffrey Monroe ably led the club in singing *God Bless America* and reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. Marcus Tripp, who has done this type of thing a few times before, offered the prayer.

Stephanie then welcomed Assistant District Governor Steve Bell and Charlotte Way, a guest of Rebecca Grist. She then offered birthday wishes to eight Rotarians who celebrate this week, including Jim Crisp and Jeff Wilhelm whose birthdays are today. Nine members have club anniversaries, including Dianne Brannen with 14 years, Richard Rader with 18, Whit Evan's with 23, Lanier Anderson with 29, and Buddy Marshall with 31 years of service.

Gary Wheat then came forward to bring us up to date on what our fellow Rotarians are doing in their work and community. Gary began by saying that Stephanie neglected to mention she is celebrating 13 years in Rotary. The Festival of Trees kicked off last week at the Museum of Arts and Sciences, which is led by Susan Welsh. Kathy McCollum and "Stuff the Truck" has been all over the news and we appreciate her dedication. Josh Rogers was recognized by Mercer University for his work in reshaping our community. The new issue of *Georgia Trend*'s "500 Most Influential Leaders" is out, and several members are mentioned, including Alex Morrison, Josh Rogers, Karla Redding-Andrews, Chris Blake, and Harold Young. Alex Morrison has been interviewed in several media concerning pickleball and the new courts Macon is building. Alex and Karla Redding-Andrews were also given special recognition in awards presented by Visit Macon.

We then had inductions of two new members, and it was fortunate to have District Governor Felix Smith present to officiate. Andrew Eck introduced Bradley Lenz, who holds the classification of Appraisal and Antiquities. He has an impressive academic background, with a Ph.D. specializing in History of Textual Technologies and Intellectual History. His professional publications have concentrated on varying aspects of aesthetics and print culture in the early American Republic. Andrew now appraises books and advises on the orderly liquidation of book collections.

President Stephanie then introduced Sarah Nicholls, who holds the classification of Clinical Labs and Analytics. With a background in biology, molecular genetics and biochemistry, she opened the first cannabis testing lab in the State of Georgia in 2020. Her clients include law enforcement authorities and hemp farms and the lab is the first and only lab registered to test medical cannabis in Georgia. She is passionate about fighting alcoholism and addiction and is a court certified expert in cannabis. Her lab is one of just three women-owned cannabis labs in the country.

Stephanie then asked Katherine McLeod to come up and receive the Paul Harris +1 recognition. Once again, we were fortunate to have the District Governor make the presentation. Felix explained that the Paul Harris Award was established in 1957 to show appreciation of significant support to the Rotary Foundation.

Assistant District Governor and Downtown Macon Rotary member Steve Bell then introduced District Governor Felix Smith. Steve began by thanking our club for their leadership and support. We assisted with the Macon Beer Fest, which Steve originated, and this year's festival set a record for the number of men tested for prostate cancer at a single-day event.

District Governor Felix Smith holds a Doctorate in Veterinary Science from UGA and owned and operated a veterinarian clinic in Perry for 40 years. He

holds many leadership positions in Rotary, is a member of the Perry club, and is also an avid fitness enthusiast who plays pickleball and runs triathlons.



Felix took the wireless microphone so he wouldn't be tethered to the podium. He began by saying his first question when visiting clubs is what can be done to increase membership. Three things are needed; a great venue, a good meal, and good speakers. He said our club excels in all three, though he excluded himself from the speaker category.

Rotary currently has 46,000 clubs worldwide, with 1.4 million members. Our District, which is all east of I-75, stretches from the South Carolina line down to the South Georgia coast, then back to Macon. He noted that our club is recognized for its generosity and has given to date over \$900,000 to the Rotary Foundation.

Rotary does many great projects worldwide, including water projects, agricultural projects, health initiatives, and help in war-torn areas. Of course, Rotary's signature achievement is in the eradication of polio. When Rotary began these efforts in 1985 there were over 335,000 polio cases in over 100 countries, and there are now only nine in two countries. We may totally eradicate polio in the next two years.

Felix then brought up his passion for increasing literacy here in Georgia. Reading proficiency at the end of the third grade is a leading indicator for graduation, and is even used by law enforcement to plan for how many prison beds will be needed in the next ten to 15 years. Just 37% of Georgia third-graders are proficient, which means 63% are not. In Macon-Bibb the numbers are even worse. Some local schools are as low as 5%. However, we are fortunate to have the United Way's Read United program here. This type of program doesn't







exist in many other parts of Georgia. Our local Read United coordinator is Sherri Flagg, and members are encouraged to contact her at 478-745-4732 ext. 206, or sflagg@unitedwaycg.com Felix related his experience in tutoring third graders and believes he has made a difference in their lives with just an hour or so per week.

Felix touched on many other things Rotary does both worldwide and at home. Our club donates \$10-12,000 each year to the CART fund which supports Alzheimer's research. He recommended tuning into the weekly Zoom call called "A la CART" which the CART fund presents.

District Governor Felix also encouraged members to attend the All Clubs Conference which will be held April 26-28, 2024 at Jekyll Island. He concluded by saying that you have to help build the society you want to live in. Our members were impressed with Felix's enthusiasm for Rotary.

Jonathan Alderman announced that the CART raffle pot was up to \$429. Once again, a winning ticket was drawn but the Queen of Clubs is still in hiding.

The meeting concluded with recitation of the Four Way Test.

Check the area ANNUAL FUND, DISASTER RELIEF FUND, or POLIO PLUS to donate, then just follow easy steps to make payment.

HOW TO MAKE UP MISSED MEETINGS

Please make up missed meetings to help our club's attendance percentage rank with District 6920 and Rotary International. Our attendance is reported each month to the district and is required to be reported before the 15th of the following month. **Members are encouraged to maintain an attendance average of 60%.**

Missed meetings must be made up 14 days before or after the meeting you miss.

You can make up from the comfort of your home or office online at http://rotaryeclubone.org/ They will email a notice of the makeup to the Club Administrator and you will be credited. Also, attendance at another Rotary Club is a great option when you are traveling!

When you make up using the **Zoom link** of our meetings listed in meeting summary above or makeup in person at another club please send an email immediately afterwards to the Club Administrator, steve@eggmedia.com so your makeup can be recorded. Do not expect the club you visit to report to our club.

Excused Absences

Members have the opportunity to receive a board approved Excused Absence during a long-term family, health, or business crisis. When a member realizes they have a situation that will keep them from attending Monday meetings for an extended period they can contact the Club Administrator or President with the reason. This contact needs to be immediate and not after the crisis. The board can approve a beginning and ending date and attendance is excused on club and district level. Short term absences are best made up online.

Club Membership Applications

We are purpose-driven leaders of influence and action. To sponsor a prospective candidate to join our membership, contact Membership Chair Charles Olson <u>EOlson200@msn.com</u> or any member of the Board of Directors to ensure a vocational classification is available for your candidate.

Once the Classification Committee approves the classification, invite your new member candidate to a weekly meeting. If the candidate expresses interest in joining our club, then ask Membership Chair Charles to send the candidate an invitation to apply online. Once the new member candidate completes the application, Board members review the application. Then, new member candidates are presented for formal approval at the monthly Board meeting. Once approved by the Board, new member candidates are announced in Throbs. Unless there is objection by any existing member, the new member is scheduled for orientation and formal induction. All members of our club need to think about who would make good Rotarians!
