They just returned from another visit to the area and, along



with them, the Suntree Club will be applying for a global grant to dig a well in Cane, a nearby village to provide running water to local residents. The grant will also include installing 55 latrines, 65 pilas (*stone water tanks, pictured*) and 87 water filters in homes in the mountain village of Guachipilin (about 45 minutes from La Paz).

Northern Palm Beaches Club:

Although the Rotary of the Northern Palm Beaches regularly meets in a picturesque glass walled clubhouse opposite a marina, it was time to head outdoors.



On May 26th, we met for a private tour of the Jupiter Lighthouse. Its presence has played a significant maritime and communications role since 1860. A little later, Jupiter would house the southernmost Western Union telegraph station, a major link in the transatlantic cable system.

On June 23rd, we met at the Bare Roots Organic Farm in Jupiter. The farm practices Aquaponics.

The basic premise of aquaponics is that the waste produced by fish is collected and sent through a series

of filtration. The majority of the waste is removed from the system, and the newly ammonia-rich water is sent through a microbial filter to convert the remaining waste into a nutrient that plants absorb. The plants sit in about one foot of water, where the roots soak up the nutrients and clean the water, which is then sent back into the fish tank, thereby producing one continuous cycle.

It's easier/cheaper to ask first than to correct later!

Including "Inc." in the logo is generally only necessary for official documents (eg letterheads and annual reports etc) - but check your club by-laws!

The old Blue and Gold logo is not to be used

"Rotary" has to be on the left of the wheel, and centred — the following logos spotted recently are not consistent with Rotary International's branding requirements.
