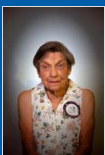

The Super Bowl of Tennis February 3/4

Sue Whittington presented information on the upcoming Tennis Tournament February 3/4. Members were reminded that the purpose of the fundraiser is to change lives by offering scholarships to those who may not receive much assistance and those trying to change the trajectory of their family story. She reviewed some of the past recipients: attended the Culinary Institute of America, working on a PhD while developing new treatments for venom poisoning, working with the deaf and blind in Jacksonville and studying aerospace engineering.

Having the recent tournaments at Harbour Ridge was a good experience. However, their inability to meet our needs led to the change to having the tournament at Buttonwood. The tournament will be slimmed down, occur in season (making more players available) and cost less for participants. Friday night will feature a Pro Night and a 60-40 raffle will be held. The Boys&Girls Club food truck will be selling food, and alcoholic beverages will be available.

A Super Bowl Square game will be an additional fundraiser-\$50 a square. The game board will be brought to next week's meeting and will then be at Buttonwood. Non-tennis players are encouraged to play!

Just prior to the tournament, club members will be responsible for contacting players, notifying them of their start time. Club members will be responsible for running the 60/40, the Super Bowl Square game, setting up, manning and taking down the Rotary table, and ensuring that all the sponsor banners are returned.

Sponsorship levels were reviewed and as soon as a sponsor commits, their banner can be put up at Buttonwood. Sponsorships are the largest income, so having as many as possible, and acquiring new sponsors is critical. Sue Whittington presented a sponsor check from Morgan Stanley.

Sign-up sheets for volunteers will be circulated.

Buttonwood Tennis Club has had their courts re-surfaced and new lighting installed, making it a perfect location for the tournament. Sue emphasized that a lot of tennis players are not affiliated with country clubs, so there is a need to publicize the tournament where tennis is played, not just clubs. Posters were handed out to members to post around the area. The registration form is live on the club website and can be accessed by a link or a QR code. Members were encouraged to digitally post tournament information on community websites and Facebook pages.
