GUEST SPEAKER:



President Elect Susan Frey introduced our guests from the Satellite Beach Fire Department (SBFD), Fire Chief David Abernathy, and the day's speaker, Lt. Kevin Duclos. Before hearing Lt. Duclos's presentation, two of our members were personally thankful to this organization – Jock Walker said a house down the street from his had recently caught fire and the SBFD was able to put it out. Jean Hender also indicated that SBFD's paramedics saved her son Gordon two years ago when he suffered a heart attack.

Here are takeaways from Lt. Duclos's presentation:

- 1. Have smoke detectors in each bedroom, in the hallway between them and in the main living areas. He recommended getting long life detectors that run on the power grid. Have carbon monoxide detectors in kitchen and garage and a heat detector in the kitchen as well.
- 2. Know where your fire extinguishers are and make sure they are readily available. Check for expiration dates. Class A extinguishers are good for wood and paper; Class B are good for fuels and grease, Class C are good for electrical. A Class ABC is good for all but messy to use.
- 3. Don't overload plug ins. Make sure wires aren't exposed in outlets and use wiring for designated use.
- 4. Clean dryer vent stacks.
- 5. Clean fireplaces. (Per Matt Smith's recent experience with a chimney fire last year), clean chimneys as well.
- 6. Close bedroom doors at night and have something ready to block beneath the doors. Smoke seeks open spaces
- 7. Have an escape plan and designated meeting place.
