<u>GUEST SPEAKER:</u> President Jay Anderson introduced our speaker Bob Barnes, who founded the Children's Hunger Project in Brevard County in 2010 and is now the founder of Aspiration Academy. The goal of the Hunger Project is to augment families who have children on the reduced/free meal programs during school with weekend meals. It is believed there is a direct correlation be-

tween hunger and learning. When they started, they only had food for 27 children, in 2021 they provided food for 2,900 children in 47 Brevard schools. There are other factors that influence a child's ability to succeed in school which is why Bob founded Aspiration Academy – to help underprivileged children learn better in school and develop self confidence. As Bob explained to us, most children have some kind of additional support - the gifted, the athletes but once low income children get behind there is no safety net. Bob's organization tries to provide teachers, mentors, support groups to help these children achieve their highest level of education or job training.
