# Happening This Week



Anne Gannon has a rich and distinguished record of public service in Florida. She is currently serving her fourth term as the Constitutional Tax Collector in Palm Beach County. Elected in 2006, she saw an opportunity to revamp an antiquated bureaucracy into a top-notch client-driven service agency. Anne is the first woman to hold this office.

Anne served as President of the Florida Tax Collectors' Association for the 2019-20. Anne twice received the Florida Tax Collectors Association's "Excellence and Innovation in Financial Operations" award. She also received the "Excellence in Government Leadership" award from the National Association of Government Accountants. And was invited to address the International Deming Research Center at Fordham University about her innovations and quality management. She has received numerous state and local awards for the office's public awareness campaigns and educational publications.

Employee health and wellness are important to Anne. Her wellness initiative at the Tax Collector's Office is designed to reduce the incidence of chronic disease and hold the line on escalating health insurance costs. As a result of these efforts, the agency was awarded the "Fit Friendly Workplace" designation by the American Heart Association in 2015.

Anne, an avid gardener, is honored to have been appointed to the board of directors for the Mounts Botanical Garden of Palm Beach County. She is proud that her garden was included as one of the gardens visited during the 2022 Native Plant Garden Tour.

She is a member of the Delray Beach Chamber of Commerce and is a long-standing supporter of the Center for Reproductive Policy and Law, and both the Statewide Task Force on Human Trafficking and the Palm Beach County Human Trafficking Coalition.

She served 12 years on the board of directors for JFK Medical Center and was an Honorary Chair of the Palm Beach County Brain Cancer 5K Run.

Prior to her tenure as Constitutional Tax Collector serving Palm Beach County, Anne served six years in the Florida Legislature representing District 88 from 2000-2002 and District 86 from 2002-2006.


**COURSES COMPLETIONS BY YEAR**

## Rotary Donor Recognition

The **Paul Harris Fellow** recognition acknowledges individuals who contribute, or who have contributions made in their name, of \$1,000 to The Rotary Foundation.

Rotary established the recognition in 1957 to encourage and show appreciation for substantial contributions to what was then the Foundation's only program, Rotary Foundation Fellowships for Advanced Study, the precursor to Ambassadorial Scholarships.

The first Paul Harris Fellows included past RI Director Allison G. Brush, who served during the 1937-38 Rotary year, and longtime RI Treasurer Rufus F. Chapin, both for donations made in 1946. Mrs. Adan Vargas was the first woman to receive the recognition, for a gift made in 1953. Mrs. Harry L. Jones was the second, and one of only five people recognized for contributions actually made in that inaugural year.

Early Paul Harris Fellows received a certificate of recognition. In 1969, the Foundation unveiled the first Paul Harris Fellow medallion at the Rotary Convention in Honolulu, Hawaii, USA. Japanese metal artist Fiju Tsuda created the piece under the direction of former Foundation Trustee Kyozo Yuasa. Today, Paul Harris Fellows receive a certificate and pin. They are also eligible to buy a Paul Harris Fellow medallion.

Rotarians have a tradition of supporting the Foundation by honoring others. Ida LeTulle Taylor became a Paul Harris Fellow in 1978 when her husband, Vann Taylor, who was serving as a district governor, made a donation in her name in honor of their 34th wedding anniversary. The gift also made her the 25,000th Paul Harris Fellow.

# **Rotary Donor Recognition**

## **Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member**

When you give \$100 or more per year to the Annual Fund.

### **Benefactor**

When you include the Endowment Fund as a beneficiary of \$1,000 or more in your estate plans or when you donate \$1,000 or more to the fund outright. Benefactors receive a certificate and insignia to wear with a Rotary or Paul Harris Fellow pin.

## **Paul Harris Fellow**

When you give \$1,000 or more to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, or an approved Foundation grant. To recognize someone else as a Paul Harris Fellow, you can give that amount in their name. Learn more about Paul Harris Fellow recognition.

## **Multiple Paul Harris Fellow**

When you give additional gifts of \$1,000 or more to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, or an approved Foundation grant.

## **Paul Harris Society member**

When you elect to contribute \$1,000 or more annually to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, or an approved Foundation grant. Learn more about the Paul Harris Society.

## **Major Donor**

When your cumulative donations reach \$10,000. Major Donors can choose to receive a crystal recognition piece and a Major Donor lapel pin or pendant. NOTE: Name recognition is not automatic and needs to be reported to RI staff. Recognition items commemorate giving at these levels:

Level 1: \$10,000 to \$24,999 Level 2: \$25,000 to \$49,999 Level 3: \$50,000 to \$99,999 Level 4: \$100,000 to \$249,999
