Notes for the Christmas parade participants and vehicles

Line up starts at 3pm. You must be in your designated spot no later than 3:45pm.

We are #46, which should be located on Douglas Avenue in front or near the front of the Dunedin Public Library so that will be really convenient. We are an even number so we are on the right side of the street.

Vehicles enter at Milwaukee Avenue and Union Street. Turn West onto Union toward Douglas. Only the vehicles in the parade with the green pass with our number displayed in the front window will be allowed to enter Douglas Ave via Union Street.

Anyone walking or accompanying the vehicles should be dropped off at the Dunedin Public Library. Enter the Library from Milwaukee Ave. to Helen Drive; exit via Plaza Drive (right Turn Only). THERE IS NO PARKING ALLOWED AT THE LIBRARY.

At the end walkers will exit to the west (left) via sidewalks near Skinner Blvd. Continue down Skinner to Pinellas Trail. DO NOT STOP ON SKINNER. Vehicles will exit east (right) onto Skinner Blvd. DO NOT GET PICKED UP AT SKINNER/DOUGLAS.

CANDY - small candy such as mints, tiny candy canes, tootsie rolls, can be tossed underhand or handed the the viewers. No throwing the candy overhand or hard.


ATTIRE - No Santa costumes allowed. You can wear Santa hats but not the full costume.
