TRIBUTE TO CAROLE ANNE: Welch Agnew recently lost his wife, Carole Anne, who suffered from memory problems her last few years. She and Welch knew each other as kids, growing up with a bare field separating their childhood homes. Carole Anne was a year older, and was the fastest runner in school, which put her out of the reach for a romantic relationship. But they were good friends, with Carole Anne serving as his campaign manager when he ran for class president. She went to Baylor and Welch was enrolled at West Point a year later. By now, they were truly nest door neighbors as her family completed their home on the empty lot. Obviously, she could not resist a man dressed in white at the senior Ring Hop, and after Welch graduated, they were married. Welch and his best friend went to flight school to delay going to Vietnam for 6 months, giving the couple and Welch's buddies some of the best times of their lives as they partied hard. Carole Ann did not drink, which was too bad (but sounds like a good person to have around when others do). All men returned from Vietnam and then went to Seal school. He taught at West Point for 3 years, then spent time in Spain and other European countries. After leaving the army, he started another career upon graduation from vet school and moved to Dunedin, taking a position to head Pinellas County Animal Services. He and Carole Anne have one daughter, Lainie, and several granddaughters. The memorial service will be at 2 pm on November 30 at the First Presbyterian Church.

Priscilla's grandson is home from protecting the border with a promotion to 1st Lieutenant. Mel reported on our turkey project: 66 turkeys with 19 to DHMS, 15 to Mease Life staff, 3 to Pinellas County sheriffs, 3 to Shepherd's Village and others. Mary Beth introduced her friend, who moved to Dunedin, and Rob mentioned his guest is lined up for a future program on National Parks. Honorary member, Chuck Croasmun showed to get a look at the DGC, saying our Rotary meeting is one of the three things that get him to rise early in the morning.

PROGRAM: Bryan Stern of Grey Bull Rescue, kept us enthralled with tales of rescues. They go where others will not and have accomplished 12 jailbreaks from Russia. Careful strategy and planning, not guns, are needed

for those missions. The group can often arrive on the scene to help before military or government gets approval to go, such as the fires in Mauii. They hold the record for people in a Black Hawk helicopter

(33) after one rescue. They get behind the lines and become "friends" wiht the locals, which helps when a mission is planned. The group has 2 paid staff and the balance are volunteers. To date, they've accomplished 725 missions without any losses with 100% success rate.
