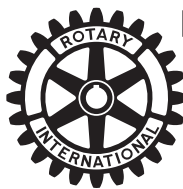

Speaker

Last week, our Club had the pleasure of hosting the Pasco County Sheriff's Office (PCSO). Truly great humans~ interesting, articulate, and passionate about Pasco Sheriff's Charities. But it was the four-legged sweetheart who stole the show and our hearts. We met Woodie, a 4-year-old female Plott Hound from North Carolina State. She resembles the hound dogs we all know and love: huge, floppy ears, gangly legs, boundless energy, and a whole lot of licks. Her entire being radiates love.

Woodie is one of four emotional support dogs in PCSO's impressive 60-canine roster. Each dog is funded entirely by private donors, at a cost of \$15,000 per pup. Her warmth is undeniable, making her mission, emotionally supporting all varieties of humans, easy to understand. Inspector Arthur Madden, her BFF, work partner and caretaker for life, shared the cutest story about Woodie. When he readies himself for work and she doesn't want to go, Woodie runs and hides in the exact same spot, every time, behind the sofa. Inspector Madden laughed, saying, "Does she think I won't remember, or, won't be able to find her?"

The warmth in his eyes as he spoke about his girl was just adorable. And when he interacted with her, it was obvious that these two are soulmates. Her silent protest when she wants a comfy cozy day at home reminds us that even the bravest among us can still be quirky - anything female usually is - and that is a-ok.

While Woodie may be the face of comfort and sweetness, the PCSO canine unit is a powerhouse of skill and service. Bloodhounds and other spe-



cialized breeds are trained for everything from drug detection and cadaver recovery, search and rescue, emotional support and community engagement. Thankfully, these dogs are not used as tools. They are loved, trusted officers, teammates and family members. In attendance, representing the Pasco County Sheriff's Office and Charities were Chief Chase Daniels, Undersheriff and President of Pasco Sheriff's Charities; Inspector Arthur Madden, Woodie's handler and BFF; Inspector Jimmy Hall; Jennifer Rose, Operations Manager for FIRST, (the acronym is for Florida's Forensic Institute for Research, Security and Tactics); Bobbi Pridemore, Secretary and Treasurer for Pasco Sheriff's Charities; and Captain Justin Wetherington, Community Engagement.

The presentation offered insight into Sheriff Nocco's dedication, and the depth of it, shared by him and his team, to the PCSO's canine program. Officers involved in the program know from the start they are signing up for a lifelong commitment. When their canine partner retires, they retire with their human partner. Pasco Sheriff's Charities foots the bill for the care and comfort of their canines for life. They have their own, special retirement plan and it is well deserved. Thank you Inspector Madden, Miss Woodie, and everyone from the Sheriff's Office for sharing your incredible work with us. We applaud all you do, every day, with or without a puppy!

Monthly Matters

September Reflections

Florida's Colorful Coasts

Florida is not just a peninsula, it is an eclectic landscape of stories. Each coast carries its own legacy, its own rhythm, its own reinvention and definitely its own vibe. As we close out September, we trace the state's spirit through its colorfully named coasts, each demonstrating a different kind of RESILIENCE.

The First Coast

Where Florida's Story Begins

Stretching from Fernandina to St. Augustine, this is Florida's oldest European-settled region. Fort Caroline and Castillo de San Marcos echo Spain's fight to claim La Florida. Old forts show off Florida's Spanish roots, Jacksonville's skyline shows how far it's come, and St. Augustine still feels like Florida's heartbeat, full of history.

The Cultural Coast

Art, opera and architectural elegance, Sarasota and its barrier islands earned this moniker for their rich arts scene. The Ringling legacy lives on in museums and theaters, while Siesta Key and Longboat Key offer beachside serenity. With 13 stages in a one-mile radius, it's Florida's performing arts capital.

The Emerald Coast

The panhandle is full of charm. Once dubbed the "Playground of the Gulf," it stretches from Pensacola to Panama City and was built on fishing, military roots, and sugary-white sand. Destin earned its nickname as the "World's Luckiest Fishing Village," while Fort Walton Beach became a spring break staple. Today, luxury homes line 30A, and eco-tourism~ the traveling of tourists to natural areas, supporting local communities~ is reshaping the region's identity.

The Forgotten Coast

Florida's "last quiet frontier" is tucked between Mexico Beach and St. Marks. This area, a panhandle gem, was literally left off state maps, hence, the name. Apalachicola was once the Oyster Capital of the World, and Port St. Joe hosted Florida's first constitutional convention. Today, it's notorious for its unspoiled beaches, maritime heritage, and slow-living ethos.

The Fun Coast

Speed, surf and sand, the Fun Coast is centered on Daytona Beach, nicknamed the "birthplace of speed," where stock car racing evolved into NASCAR. Drive-on beaches and motorsports history meet family-friendly

vibes. Ormond Beach and Ponce Inlet offer quieter charm, and AIA keeps the coastal vibe alive.

The Gold Coast

Glamour, grit and global influence, from Palm Beach to Miami, this coast earned its name from wealth and high-rise glitz and glam. Once shaped by land booms and Cuban immigration, it's now a global crossroads of finance, fashion, and nightlife. Strong communities and blended cultures have created an epic vibe.

The Lee Island Coast

Shells, Sanibel and southwest sophistication stretch across Lee County which includes Fort Myers, Cape Coral, and the sea-shelly shores of Sanibel and Captiva. Once Calusa territory and later Spanish fishing camps, it's now a boating and birding paradise. Cape Coral's canals rival Venice, and Fort Myers is booming with development.

The Nature Coast

Springs, swamps and seagrass sanctuaries, stretching from Wakulla to Pasco County, compose the Big Bend region. A haven for manatees, scallopers, and birders, it was once home to Timucua tribes and early Spanish explorers. Today it hosts aquatic preserves and wildlife refuges. Crystal River and Homosassa are hotspots for snorkeling, while Cedar Key keeps the old Florida spirit alive.

The Space Coast Launchpads & Lagoon Magic

From Titusville to Melbourne, this coast was forever changed by the 1950 launch of Bumper 8. Kennedy Space Center became the heart of American spaceflight, with Cocoa Beach balancing astronauts with surfers. Today, SpaceX and Blue Origin fuel a new boom, and bioluminescent kayaking adds natural wonder to the mix.

The Sun Coast

Bright skies and Barrier Island bliss, the Sun Coast is centered around Tampa Bay, and boasts the most sunshine days per year. St. Pete Beach, Clearwater, and Sarasota grew from sponge docks and citrus groves into trendy beach towns. Today, it's a mix of retirees, rooftop bars, and revitalized downtowns. Tampa's Gasparilla keeps the pirate spirit alive.

The Treasure Coast

Shipwrecks, Citrus and Small-Town Charm, the coast was named for the 1715 Spanish Treasure Fleet that wrecked off-shore. Treasure Coast includes Vero Beach, Fort Pierce, and Stuart. Once sleepy citrus towns, they now blend boutique tourism with maritime lore. Art galleries, fishing piers, and a slower pace define the modern vibe.

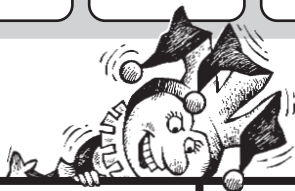

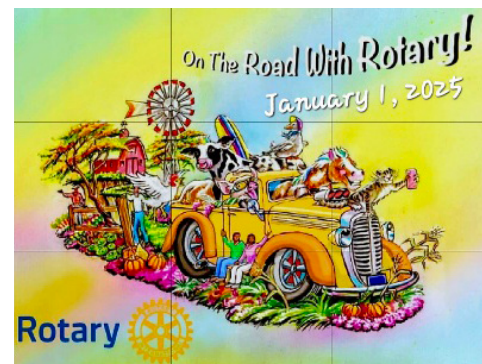
