The delegate reservation process for this year's S4TL is now open for clubs to reserve and pay for delegates they wish to send.

S4TL will be held at Florida Southern College from Sunday, June 15th, 2025 through Saturday, June 22nd, 2025.

I am pleased to announce that clubs can now make and pay for delegate reservations using a new online facility.

The attached letter contains additional information about S4TL and the reservation process.

To start your reservation simply go to: <https://seminar-delegate-reservation-form.cheddarup.com>

Then follow these steps:

1. The link will take you to a site with some general information and allow you to add 1 to 4 delegates to your cart. **To Add Delegates make sure to scroll to the end of the information.**
2. Once you have added the # of desired delegate reservations, select **Continue to View the Delegate Reservation Request form** where you will enter the required information including your club's name, the name & contact details for your club President, along with a 2nd contact for your club.
3. Once you have filled in all the fields, the form can be signed with a digital signature and saved.
4. You then must select Continue at the bottom of the page to go to Check Out and Payment, where you can pay via credit card, electronic funds transfer(eCheck), or with a paper check. **Please note that credit card payments will incur a processing fee. This is the default payment option but feel free to change it to an eCheck or a standard check via mail, for which there are no fees charged.**
5. You will receive 2 emails: 1 will confirm your reservation along with the information you provided; The other will be a receipt for payment or instructions on how to pay via check by mail.

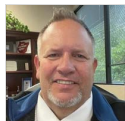

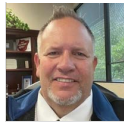
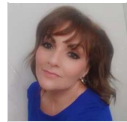
