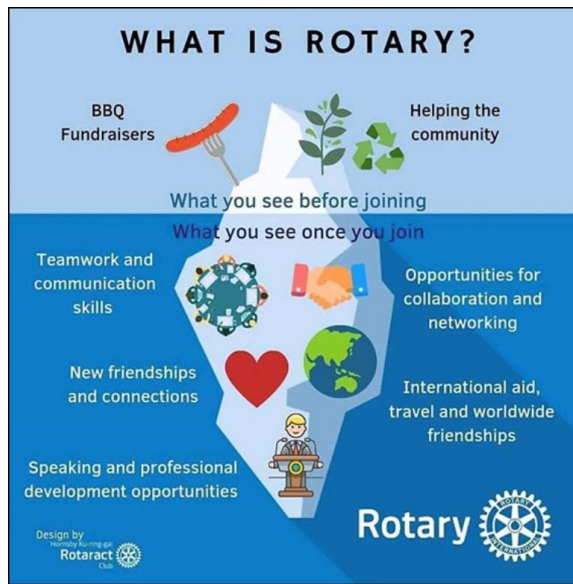
Includes Sunsail Leopard 454 - 4 Cabin Catamaran Yacht with Skipper, only for San Cap Rotary members.

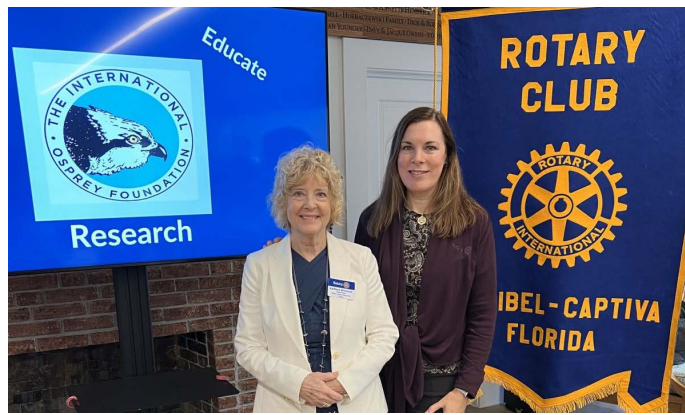

**Last Weeks Speaker:
 Kathryn Brintnall,
 The International Osprey Foundation(TIOF)**



Kathryn Brintnall grew up in Michigan, transplanted to New Jersey following a job offer after college, and is now planted firmly on Sanibel Island. She taught elementary school for 43 years, hoping to inspire children to love learning, to have a sense of social justice, and to fall in love with nature. Her experiences following her Teacher of the Year award led her into the world of advocacy. She took advantage of that opportunity to educate a wider audience about the things she was most passionate about. After her retirement from education, Kathryn threw herself into following her other passions: adventure travel, photography, learning to play the piano, as well as nature studies and environmental stewardship.

Her island activities include working at CROW (the Clinic for the Rehabilitation of Wildlife), participating in the Weeds and Seeds group under the sponsorship of SCCF, and volunteering at the "Ding" Darling Wildlife Refuge as a rover. She is currently the President of The International Osprey Foundation (TIOF). Kathryn joined the board of TIOF in April of 2019, after being an Osprey Nest Monitor for several years. Kathryn loves being out on the water in her kayak, with her binoculars and camera trained on the nests, taking notes and collecting data for TIOF. Kathryn's first role on the TIOF Board of Directors was Secretary. Since then, she has worn many additional hats including: public relations, newsletter editor, and volunteer coordinator. "It is an honor and a privilege to work for the preservation and protection of the ospreys, and to be their voice," stated Ms. Brintnall.

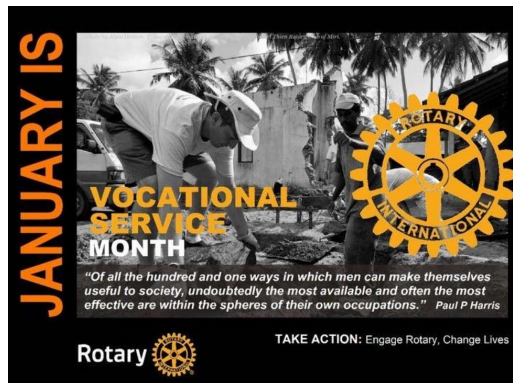

Rotary January Theme



The [Object of Rotary](#) is a philosophical statement of Rotary's purpose and the responsibilities of Rotarians. The concept of vocational service is rooted in the Second Object, which calls on Rotarians to "encourage and foster":

Those objectives are:

- To encourage and foster high ethical standards in business and professions, to recognize the worthiness of all useful occupations, to dignify the Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.
- To apply the ideal of service in personal, business and community life.
- To advance international understanding and goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of businessmen and professional men and women united in the ideal of service.

Paul Harris wrote: "Each Rotarian is a connecting link between the idealism of Rotary and their trade or profession". Vocational Service is the way Rotary fosters and supports the application of the Ideal of Service to the pursuit of all vocations.

It is the shared responsibility of both the Rotary Club and its members.

The role of the Club is to implement and encourage the objectives by its own actions in dealing with the community and by the development of projects that enable members to use their vocational talents in the service of the community. The role of members is to conduct themselves and their businesses in accordance with Rotary principles, and support the Vocational Service projects that the club has developed.

During January, Rotarians are encouraged to focus on this important avenue of Rotary service. Discussions on vocational service can lead to projects that not only develop the ethical consciousness and vocational skills of Rotarians but also the talents within their communities. Vocational Service Month is an opportunity to begin year-long vocational service activities, ranging from Rotary discussions to awards to community projects
